*The County of Hertford (Restricted Roads) (No. 2) (Amendment) Order, 1970*

*Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit, Rowley Lane, Well End, Elstree*

#### LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Lancashire County Council (Various Roads, Ramsbottom) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1970*

Notice is hereby given that on the 25th August 1970 the Lancashire County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays in any of the following lengths of road in the Urban District of Ramsbottom:

- (1) The south side of Bolton Road West A.676 from the junction with Hope Street for a distance of 120 feet in a westerly direction.
- (2) The east side of Hope Street for a distance of 55 feet from its junction with Bolton Road West.
- (3) The west side of Hope Street for a distance of 30 feet from its junction with Bolton Road West.

The Order contains exemptions to allow a vehicle to wait for as long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded; to enable a person to board or alight; and to enable it to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition and the maintenance of essential services.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order may within 6 weeks from the 25th August 1970 apply to the High Court for the purpose.
