TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1968— SECTION 94

Somerset (Footpath No. 5/15 at Lansdown, Charlcombe) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 21st August 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Somerset County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be that part of the public footpath No. 5/15 at Lansdown which runs from the north side of the Lansdown to Bath road in a generally easterly direction towards Charlcombe Grove Farm, will be diverted along the north-western and northern boundaries of the field comprising O.S. Plot No. 73 which the Bath City Council propose to lay out for playing field purposes.

Somerset (Footpaths at Alhampton in the parish of Ditchat) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on the 17th August 1970 the Somerset County Council confirmed the above-named Order.
