SCOTLAND

The QUEEN has been pleased to award The Queen's Police Medal for Gallantry to the late Constable Angus McLeod Mackenzie and to the late Constable Edward Alexander Barnett of the City of Glasgow police force in recognition of their gallantry in the following circumstances:

On 30th December 1969. Constable Mackenzie and Constable Barnett, with other members of the force, entered a house and questioned three men about the comtents of two suitcases found there. The party separated to search the house and one of them was shot by a gunman with a pistol. Constable Mackenzie and Constable Barnett heard the shot and ran to the scene. In trying to disarm the gunman, Constable Mackenzie and Constable Barnett were both shot in the head at close range. Constable Mackenzie was shot in the head a second time by the gunman, and was found to be dead on arrival at hospital. Constable Barnett died four days later.

The late Constable Mackenzie and the late Constable Barnett, knowing that the gunman was prepared to shoot to resist arrest, showed great courage in making resolute attempts to disarm him, at the cost of their lives.

ROYAL WARRANT OF PRECEDENCE

MARQUESS OF TWEEDDALE

The Queen has been graciously pleased, by Royal Warrant bearing date the 27th day of July 1970, to ordain and declare that Maryoth Christina, wife of John Hastings James, Esquire, Companion of The Most Honourable Order of the Bath, and Caroline Susan Elizabeth, formerly wife of Richard Noel Marshall Armitage and now wife of Charles Tyrrell,

shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the daughters of a Marquess which would have been due to them had their father Lord Edward Douglas John Hay survived his brother William George Montagu, Marquess of Tweeddale in the Peerage of Scotland, and thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Marquess of Tweeddale.

And to command that the said Royal Order and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms and in Her Majesty's Lyon Office in Edinburgh. (306)

ROYAL LICENCE

Whitehall, London S.W.1. 16th September 1970.

The Queen has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Robert Julian Bacchus-Goldie-Taubman, Gentleman, formerly Robert Julian Bacchus, of Little Martins in the Parish of Slindon in the County of Sussex, Her Majesty's Royal Licence and Authority bearing date the 16th day of September 1970, that he may take and assume and bear and use the Arms of Goldie-Taubman quarterly with those of Bacchus and the Crests of Goldie-Taubman with that of Bacchus, and that the said Arms and Crests may in like manner be taken and assumed and borne and used by his issue, the whole according to the Laws of Arms; the said Armorial Bearings being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in the said College of Arms. (307)

The QUEEN has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 25th day of September 1970, to confer the dignity of a
