TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS 1962 AND 1968

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that an Order has been made under section 153 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 entitled "The Stopping Up of Highways (London Borough of Hammersmith) (No. 4) Order 1970" authorising the stopping up of the remainder of Lurgan Street, London W.6.

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968 to authorise the stopping up of lengths of the Street (A.137) and Bergholt Road (B.1070), Brantham, Suffolk in the interests of the safety of users of and to facilitate the movement of traffic on the A.137 Brantham By-Pass which is a highway to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962.
