ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1967

The Trunk Road (High Street, Cheltenham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1970

The Secretary of State for the Environment has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in that length of the A.40 Trunk Road, known as High Street in the Borough of Cheltenham, which extends from the south-east side of its junction with Grosvenor Street to its junction with Hewlett Road and College Road.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks of the 30th November 1970 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
