NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Great Ouse River Authority by the North-West Norfolk Water Board for a variation to their existing licence number 6/33/64/2 to abstract the following quantities of water from the chalk and greensand at the Hillington Pumping Station, National Grid Reference 743 262 in the Freebridge Lynn Rural District.

This application is to vary the existing licence to enable water to be abstracted not only from the chalk but also from the greensand. It is not proposed to increase the total aggregate pumping rates which will remain as: 105,000 gallons per hour, 2,500,000 gallons per day and 800,000,000 gallons per year.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY LICENCES TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Welland and Nene River Authority by the South Lincolnshire Water Board to vary the licence, serial number 5/31/13/G/63 to abstract water from the boreholes in the Lincolnshire Limestone at the Tallington Pumping Station situate at Grid reference TF 0978 0872 at Tallington in the rural district of South Kesteven in the county of Lincoln (parts of Kesteven), and to vary the licence, serial number 5/31/13/G/46 to abstract water from the boreholes in the Lincolnshire Limestone at Pilsgate Pumping Station situate at Grid Reference TF 0705 0596 at Pilsgate in the rural district of Barnack in the County of Huntingdon and Peterborough.

The variation applied for is:

- To increase the daily abstraction from the borehole at Tallington from one million gallons per day to two million gallons per day.
- To increase the daily abstraction from the boreholes at Pilsgate from 336 thousand gallons per day to one million two hundred and fifty thousand gallons per day.

The Board will on the variation of the above-mentioned licences apply for a reduction in the quantities to be abstracted from the boreholes at Etton Pumping Station from three million five hundred thousand gallons per day to three million gallons per day and at Deeping St. Nicholas Pumping Station from four hundred thousand gallons per day to three hundred and forty-six thousand gallons per day and will surrender the current licences to abstract water from the Lincolnshire Limestone at the pumping stations situate at Ryhall Road, Stamford; Belmesthorpe; Deeping St. James; Briggs Bore, Deeping St. James; Clipsham; Whitewater, Stamford; Wothorpe; Bonemill, Stamford; Green Lane, Stamford; and Thornhaugh, amounting in the aggregate to two million and thirty-five thousand gallons per day.
