

WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL

The City of Worcester (Blockhouse) (Prohibition of Waiting) (No. 8) Order 1970

Notice is hereby given that the Worcester City Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays along the following lengths of road:

South side of Charles Street, from Temperance Street westwards for a distance of 160 feet to the limit of the existing Order;

West side of Temperance Street, from Charles Street to Carden Street;

South side of Carden Street;

North side of Carden Street, from Temperance Street to Union Street;

North side of Providence Street;

West side of St. Paul's Street, from George Street to Providence Street;

East side of St. Paul's Street, from George Street to St. Paul's Walk;

South side of Spring Gardens, from St. Paul's Street westwards for a distance of 190 feet.

Certain exceptions will be provided in the Order including those for boarding and alighting from vehicles, loading and unloading of goods, building, demolition, and maintenance of essential services.

A copy of the proposed Order, a map showing the roads to which the proposed Order relates and a copy of the statement of the Council's reasons for the proposal may be inspected during normal office hours at my office, or at the City Library, Foregate Street, Worcester.

Objections to the proposal, specifying the grounds on which they are made, must be sent to me in writing by 6th January 1971.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER
TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1968, SECTION 94
The Birmingham (Beeches Farm Estate) Public Path Stopping-up Order, 1969

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th day of December 1969, the Birmingham City Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish part of the public right of way running from Longbridge Lane, Northfield, Birmingham, starting at a point of 113 yards north-east of Longbridge Lane and extending to a point 90 yards north of Cofton Road and part of the public right of way leading from that footpath to Fairfax Road starting from its junction therewith and extending northwards for 50 yards and create an alternative highway in lieu.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Department, The Council House, Birmingham B1 1BB, and may be inspected, free of charge, at the Town Clerk's Department between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week day.

This Order becomes operative as from the date hereof but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made therein has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962, within 6 weeks from the date hereof make application for the purpose to the High Court.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1968, SECTION 94

Belper Rural District Council (Footpath No. 64, Crich) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th November 1970, the Belper Rural District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert approximately 183 yards of public footpath No. 64 from the northern boundary of field O.S. 9189 at its junction with Sandy Lane, Crich, to the south-east boundary of the said field, and to provide an alternative footpath.

This Order becomes operative as from the date on which it is certified by Belper Rural District Council that the provisions of Article 2 of the Order have been complied with, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 within 6 weeks from the 2nd December 1970, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
