

The highway known as Blackwall Stairs running in a southerly direction at the junction of Blackwall Way and Yabsley Street in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets in the Thames Petty Sessional Division of the Inner London Commission Area as indicated by pink colour on the plan hereinafter referred to and which said highway has a width of 25 feet at its northern end (C-D on the said plan) and a width of 23 feet at its southern end (A-B on the said plan) and a length of 58 feet on its western side (B-C on the said plan) and a length of 51 feet or thereabouts on its eastern side (A-D on the said plan) is more particularly delineated by metes, bounds and admeasurements on the said plan and thereon coloured pink.

The aforesaid plan (Number B/20385) has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Office of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets, Town Hall, Bethnal Green, London E.2, where it may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Any person who uses the highway and any other person who would be aggrieved by the making of the Order applied for has a right to be heard by the Magistrates' Court above-mentioned.—Dated 12th November 1970.

The Southam Rural District Council (SM.26, Harbury) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 10th November 1970, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Southam Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be to divert the public right of way running from a county road 347 metres north of Harbury Hall, westwards for a distance of 82.25 metres then turning northwards through the yards of Bull Ring Farm for a distance of 97.5 metres to a line running from a point approximately 67 metres north-east of Bull Ring Farm, Harbury, south-eastwards across field O.S. No. 286 for a distance of 79.25 metres then turning southwards through the eastern side of field O.S. 279 for a distance of 76.2 metres to the county road 347 metres north of Harbury Hall.
