

Longbridge Hollow commencing at a point on the highway from Milton Street to Litlington and Eastbourne opposite its junction with the highway to Alfriston and Lewes and running in an east south-easterly direction for a distance of 2,251 feet or thereabouts to the highway running from Wilmington and Polgate to Litlington and Eastbourne as is shown coloured brown and indicated A-B on the plan marked "Longbridge Hollow" (hereinafter called "the said plan"), subject to the reservation of a bridleway.

Tyldesley Urban District Council Public Path Extinguishment Order (No. 1) 1970

Notice is hereby given that the Tyldesley Urban District Council made the above-named Order on the 24th day of November 1970, and it is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the above Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the public footpath No. 277 running in a north-easterly direction from the junction of public paths Nos. 275 and 278 to the junction of public paths Nos. 273 and 279 situate on land at Allwood House Farm, Astley.

Wareham and Purbeck Rural District (Winfrith Newburgh) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 30th day of November 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Wareham and Purbeck Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public footpath No. 3, running from a point 65 yards north-west of its junction with bridleway No. 2 northwards through the Atomic Energy Establishment to the Poole to Dorchester railway line, to a line running from the

said point westwards and northwards, to the west of the Atomic Energy Establishment, to the said point south of the Poole to Dorchester railway line.

INITIAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR GREATER LONDON

Lewisham Clock Tower Comprehensive Development Area (No. 7)

Notice is hereby given that proposals for alterations or additions to the above Development Plan comprising the rezoning of about 12 acres of land within the above comprehensive development area were on the 30th day of November 1970 submitted to the Department of the Environment. The proposals involve (a) rezonings from Light Industry, Commerce, Car Park, Open Space, Main Framework Roads and Minor Roads to a Mixed Use intended primarily for Shops, Offices and Car Parks and (b) the insertion of a new Principal Traffic Route and consequential amendments from Light Industry to Open Space and from Main Framework Roads to Light Industry. Both (a) and (b) are to be programmed for development during the period 1970 to 1975.

A certified copy of the proposals as submitted has been deposited for public inspection in Room 654, Main Building at The County Hall, London S.E.1, and at the Town Hall, Catford, London S.E.6.

The copies of the proposals so deposited, together with copies or relevant extracts of the Development Plan, and an Explanatory Statement, are available for inspection free of charge by all persons interested at the places mentioned above during the usual office hours.

Any objection or representation with reference to the proposals may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment at Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 18th day of January 1971 and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made. Persons making an objection or representation may register their names and addresses with the Greater London Council (Reference LP/H.1) and will then be entitled to receive notice of any amendment of the Development Plan made as a result of the proposals.
