ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967—Section 12 The Temporary Restriction of Traffic (Camden) (No. 3) Order 1970

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council intend to make an Order under section 12 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be, in the London Borough of Camden, to revoke the restrictions imposed in Camden Road by the Temporary Restriction of Traffic (Camden) Order 1970 and, commencing on 14th December 1970 to prohibit vehicles from entering that area of the carriageway of Camden Road:

- (a) which is bounded on the north-west by so much of the north-western kerbline of that road as extends from a point 10 feet south-west of a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 80 and 82 Camden Road north-Eastwards for a distance of 110 feet and which has a general width throughout of 7 feet; and
- (b) which is bounded on the south-east by so much of the south-eastern kerbline of that road as extends from a point 35 feet north-east of a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 80 and 82 Camden Road north-eastwards for a distance of 75 feet and which has a general width throughout of 7 feet.

Although sufficient width of Camden Road will remain to permit of two-way working, the alternative routes will be:

- (a) for north-eastbound traffic, by way of Kentish Town Road, Jeffrey's Street and St. Pancras Way;
- (b) for south-westbound traffic, by way of St. Pancras Way, Pratt Street and Camden High

WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTIONS

London Borough of Croydon

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council are about to consider a proposal that they should make an Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which would be, in the London Borough of Croydon:

To impose restrictions on waiting by vehicles between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in:

Coulsdon Road (both sides) between the common boundary of Nos. 408-410 Coulsdon Road and the north-westernmost wall of No. 217 Coulsdon Road.

The restrictions would also apply to the first 60 feet of both sides of Tollers Lane and Waddington Avenue.

2. To impose restrictions on waiting by vehicles for the purpose of loading and unloading goods between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in:

Coulsdon Road, the north-east side, between he south-eastern kerb-line of Waddington Avenue and the north-westernmost wall of No. 217 Coulsdon Road.

Exemptions would be provided in the Order to permit vehicles to wait in order to pick up and set down passengers, to carry out essential services, or when used by local authorities in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, and, except as provided in paragraph 2, to load and unload goods for limited
