NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

The Tiverton Rural District Council (Bradninch & Cullompton) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1965.

Notice is hereby given that on the 26th November 1970, the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish the public right of way running from the west bank of the Mill Race at the south-east end of Oxenford Lane, Bradninch, for 154 yards east to the east side of the bridge over the River Culm thence (a) generally eastwards for 680 yards to a point on the west side of the A.38 trunk road between Cullompton and Exeter, 180 yards north-east of Weaver Bridge; (b) generally south-east for 350 yards over the River Weaver to a point on the above-mentioned road 310 yards west of the Weaver Bridge.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at The Great House, 1 St. Peter Street, Tiverton, Devon, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 8th day of December 1970, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.—Dated 8th December 1970.
