## CIVIC AMENITIES ACTS

### EAST SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

#### CIVIC AMENITIES ACT, 1967

##### Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given that the East Suffolk County Council have designated the following parts of the County as Conservation Areas for the purpose of section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967.

##### Aldeburgh

The main part of the "old town" of Aldeburgh, extending from St. Peters Road in the north to Fort Green in the south, and from Alde Lane in the west to the Moot Hall in the east. The area designated includes buildings and gardens and curtilages along the sea front, and in the various streets, including High Street and Wentworth Road, behind the sea front to a depth of approximately 150 yards, together with an area on either side of Victoria Road east, south and west of the parish church

##### Coddenham

The central part of the village of Coddenham, including buildings and gardens and curtilages in and adjoining Ipswich Road, High Street, and between Crown Corner and Blacksmith Lane.

##### Debenham

The central part of Debenham village, i.e., the old "core", including buildings and gardens and curtilages and greens, in and adjoining the High Street from Cherrytree Bridge in the south to the junction with London Hill in the north; Chancery Lane, the east end of Gracechurch Street, and the neighbourhood of "The Wash" (east of the High Street).

##### Framlingham

The main part of the "old town" of Framlingham, plus the Castle and its grounds and the open area between the Castle and Framlingham College. In the old town itself, the designated area includes build-

ings and gardens and curtilages in and adjoining Church Street, Castle Street, Double Street, Fore Street, Market Hill, Bridge Street, and Wellclose Square.

##### Needham Market

The main "core" of the town, centred on High Street, and additional areas to the east. The designated area includes buildings and gardens and curtilages in and adjoining High Street, from just south of Highlands School southwards to the junction with Barking Road (B.1078); Station yard and the north end of Coddenham Road (B.1078); Bridge Street, Hawks Mill Street, King William Street, and Constitution Hill; and the area east of the railway from Valley House and Hawks Mill, extending to the Maltings in Crown Street.

##### Orford

The old "core" of Orford, including the Castle and its grounds, and buildings and gardens and curtilages in Market Hill, Pump Street, Front Street (southern end), High Street, Rectory Road (eastern end), Burnt Lane, Doctors Lane, Daphne Road, Church Street, Castle Hill, Broad Street and Quay Street.

##### Stowmarket

The central part of the town of Stowmarket, including buildings and gardens and curtilages in Bury Street (southwards from just north of Union Street), Station Road (westwards from Stowupland Street), the area around the Parish Church including Church Walk, Church Lane and the west end of Milton Road, Ipswich Street (westwards from Milton Road), Market Place and Butter Market, Tavern Street, Crowe Street, and Abbot's Hall with its gardens and Pond, and the area of the Museum of Rural Life; and a separate area including the Railway Station and neighbouring maltings and other buildings in Prentice Road.

The precise boundaries are defined on maps, copies of which may be seen during normal office hours, at the Clerk's Department or the Planning Department, County Hall, Ipswich, or as follows:

Aldeburgh Conservation Area: Borough Offices, Victoria Road, Aldeburgh.

Coddenham Conservation Area: Gipping Rural District Council Offices, Needham Market.

Debenham Conservation Area: Gipping Rural District Council Offices, Needham Market.

Needham Market Conservation Area: Gipping Rural District Council Offices, Needham Market.

Framlingham Conservation Area: Blyth Rural District Council Offices, Rendham Road, Saxmundham.

Orford Conservation Area: Deben Rural District Council Offices, Melton Hill, Woodbridge.

Stowmarket Conservation Area: Stowmarket Urban District Council Offices, Ipswich Road, Stowmarket.
