Liskeard By-Pass, London—Penzance Trunk Road

Notice is hereby given that Public Local Inquiries will be held by Sir Arthur Hulin Gosling, K.B.E., C.B., B.Sc., F.R.S.E., F.R.I.C.S (a person appointed by the Secretary of State for the Environment for that purpose) beginning at 10.30 a.m. on 26th January 1971 at the Liskeard Borough Council Chambers, West Street, Liskeard, Cornwall, in connection with the Orders mentioned below, when representations from persons who have objected to the Orders, and from any other persons who desire to appear, will be heard. The Orders, which have been prepared in draft by the Secretary of State under the above-mentioned Acts, are:—

1. The London—Penzance Trunk Road (Liskeard By-Pass) Order 19 , notice of which was published on 21st March 1969. (This is an Order which, if made, will authorise the construction of new lengths of trunk roads at Liskeard and the de-trunking of that length of road superseded);

2. The London—Penzance Trunk Road (Liskeard By-Pass Side Roads) Order 19 , notice of which was published on 20th July 1970. (This Order, if made, will authorise the Secretary of State to improve the side roads affected by the aforesaid by-pass); and

3. The London—Penzance Trunk Road (Liskeard By-Pass) Compulsory Purchase Order (No.) 19 , notice of which was published on 29th September 1970. (This Order if made, will authorise the Secretary of State to purchase compulsorily the land necessary for the construction of the aforesaid by-pass and for the improvement of the said side roads.)

Copies of the above-mentioned draft Orders and plans referred to therein have been deposited and may be seen at all reasonable hours free of charge at the Department of the Environment, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London S.E.1; and at the offices of Cornwall C.C., County Hall, Truro, Cornwall; the Liskeard B.C., West Street, Liskeard, Cornwall, and of the Divisional Road Engineer, Government Buildings, Alphington Road, Exeter, Devon.

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968

Paraguay: Official Certificate

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Regulations 1968, he hereby recognises subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto as showing:

- (a) that the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat and the meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Certificate is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) This recognition applies to meat products imported from Paraguay but does not apply to any such meat product derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) The Official Certificate being in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat product or the package containing the meat product.
