

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 506), in the Parish of Stoughton, by stopping up that part of the path commencing at its junction with the road (B.2146), extending north-westwards for a distance of approximately 680 feet to the entrance drive of Lordington House, and substituting for that length of path a new public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the northern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending eastwards along the drive to Lordington House, for a distance of approximately 260 feet to join the road (B.2146).

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Chichester.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Chichester, Sussex, before 11th January 1971, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the West Sussex County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
