Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;(b) loading or unloading goods;

- collecting or delivering postal packets for the Post Office; the maintenance of the roads and the services therein; and by vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege.
- C. The County Borough of Rotherham (Various Roads) (One-Way Traffic) Order, 1971 The effect of this Order will be:
  - (i) to revoke the County Borough of Rotherham (Various Streets) (One-Way) Order 1958 and the County Borough of Rotherham (Howard Street) (Part) (One-way) Order 1965, which impose one-way traffic operation on parts of Eastwood Lane and Howard Street in the County Borough of Rotherham.

(ii) to amend the County Borough of Rotherham (Traffic Regulation) Order 1934 and the County Borough of Rotherham (Various Streets) (One-Way) Order 1967 in so far as those Orders impose one-way traffic operation on part of Moorgate Street and Ship Hill in the County

Borough of Rotherham.

(iii) to amend the County Borough of Rotherham (Various Streets) (One-Way) Order 1962 in so far as that Order imposes one-way traffic operation on Church Street in the County Borough of Rotherham.

(iv) to impose one-way traffic operation on the following roads in the County Borough of Rotherham in the direction specified:

From Westgate towards Moorgate Street.

From Corporation Street towards Bridgegate. An exception will permit the use of any mechanical road cleansing vehicle between the hours of 6 a.m.

The County Borough of Rotherham (Henry Street) (Prohibition of Driving) Order, 1971

When this Order comes into effect no-one will be permitted to drive a vehicle in that length of Henry Street which extends on the south-east side a distance of 37 yards from its junction with Howard Street and on the north-west side a distance of 28 yards from its junction with Effingham Street.

E. The County Borough of Rotherham (Various Roads) (Prohibition of Right Hand Turns and Left Hand Turns) Order, 1971

The effect of this Order will be to prohibit:

a right hand turn from College Street into High Street.
 a right hand turn from Doncaster Gate into College Street.
 a left hand turn from Doncaster Gate into Wellgate.
 a left hand turn from Wellgate into High Street.
 a right hand turn from Westgate into Ship Hill.

An exception will permit public service vehicles to make both right hand turns and left hand turns out of Domcaster Gate.

F. The County Borough of Rotherham (Wellgate and Mansfield Road) (Experimental Prescribed Route) Order, 1971

When this Order comes into effect no-one will be permitted to drive a vehicle down Wellgate in a northerly direction from its junction with Mansfield Road for a period of six months.

The prescribed route from Wellgate to the Town Centre is to turn left into Mansfield Road from Wellgate, to turn right into Moorgate Street from Mansfield Road, and then to turn left into High Street

Wellgate, to turn right into Moorgate Street from Mansfield Road, and then to turn left into High Street from Moorgate Street.

There will be exceptions for public service vehicles and vehicles requiring access to premises on or adjacent to Wellgate, College Street or Effingham Street.
