(OAN 11 Alveston) *Public Bridle Way Diversion Order 1970*

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th December 1970, the Gloucestershire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that length of bridle way OAN 11 in the Parish of Alveston from its junction with Greenhill Road extending in a south-westerly direction for approximately 190 yards over an 8-10 feet wide strip of land commencing from Greenhill Road at a point 66 yards south of the junction of bridle way OAN 11 with Wolfridge Ride extending in a south-westerly direction for approximately 166 yards to rejoin bridle way OAN 11.

Gloucestershire County Council (KW.41 Kingswood) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on the 4th December 1970, the Gloucestershire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that length of footpath KW.41 in the Urban District of Kingswood which extends northwards from Mount Hill Road for a distance of approximately 37 yards, over a 4-5 feet wide strip of land commencing from the junction of footpath KW.41 with Mount Hill Road extending westwards for approximately 23 yards then northwards for approximately 30 yards to rejoin the footpath KM.41.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1968—
SECTION 94

Gloucestershire County Council (OTH 104, OTH 105 and OTH 106 Thornbury) Public Paths Diversion Order, 1970.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 2nd December 1970, is about to be submitted to the Department of the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Gloucestershire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the following public rights of way at Hazel Farm, Thornbury:

1. that length of footpath OTH 106 which extends from a point approximately 30 feet from Grovesend Road for a distance of approximately 390 feet in a westerly direction.
2. that length of footpath OTH 105 which extends from its junction with footpath OTH 104, northwards for approximately 100 feet.
3. that length of footpath OTH 104 which extends—

- (a) from its junction with footpath OTH 105 north-west for approximately 30 feet.
- (b) from its junction with footpath OTH 105 south-east for approximately 80 feet

over the following six feet wide strips of land:

- (a) commencing 30 feet south of Grovesend Road extending north-west for approximately 250 feet, south-west for approximately 240 feet and then west for approximately 40 feet to rejoin footpath OTH 106.
- (b) commencing from a point 100 feet south of the junction of footpath OTH 105 with footpath OTH 106 extending south-west for approximately 100 feet then south-east for approximately 100 feet to reconnect with footpath OTH 104.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Thornbury Rural District Council, Stokefield House, Thornbury, Bristol, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor, Gloucestershire County Council, Shire Hall, Gloucester, not later than 28 days from the publication of this notice and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Gloucestershire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Department of the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Department of the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Department with the Order.
