Woods found it impossible to swim with the soldier in the prevailing conditions and decided that the best course of action would be to try to keep him afloat until help arrived. Another soldier had meanwhile dived in to assist him and between the

two of them they managed to keep the soldier afloat, although he was by this time unconscious. After six minutes in the water the men were eventually rescued by the schooner's lifeboat and brought on board the Warspite. Woods was by then
