The Trunk Road (Wrexham Road, Rhostyllen) (Restriction of Waiting) (Experimental) Order 1970

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has made an experimental Order under section 9 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. in that length of the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (A.483), known as Wrexham Road, at Rhostyllen in the County of Denbigh, which extends from its junction with Church Street to its junction with Esless Lane.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties. duties.
