### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS 1962 AND 1968

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 to authorise the stopping up of a part of Back Albert Street, Kearsley, Bolton, Lancs, to enable residential development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Mr. B. Hobson.

During 28 days from the 29th December 1970 copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Town Hall, Kearsley and may be obtained free of charge from the Secretary of State (quoting HLL 70/20/0407) at the address stated below.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days, any person may by notice to the Secretary of State (Ref. HLL 70/20/0407), St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London S.E.1, object to the making of the Order.

### *The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Chippenham)* *(Traffic Regulation) Order 1971*

The Secretary of State for the Environment proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, revoking and re-enacting with variations and additions the restrictions relating to one-way traffic and the waiting of vehicles on the London-Bristol Trunk Road (A.4) in the Borough of Chippenham, Wiltshire, the effect of which will be to:

(1) impose one-way restrictions in:

(a) Ivy Lane (south to north) between Bath Road and New Road; and

(b) New Road and The Bridge (north-west to south-east) between Ivy Lane and Bath Road;

(2) prohibit waiting:

(a) at any time in the lengths and on the sides of road and carriageway specified in Schedule 1 hereto; and

(b) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. (except Sundays) in the lengths and on the sides of road and carriageway specified in Schedule 2 hereto:

(i) for a longer period than 1 hour; or

(ii) if a period of less than 1 hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in that length or on that side of road or carriageway.

(3) prohibit loading or unloading in High Street from 25 yards to 58 yards north-west of Chapel Lane.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle except as in (3) above, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein. The Order will also exempt disabled drivers from the restrictions at 2 (b) above.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan illustrating the proposal, may be inspected during all reasonable hours at the offices of the Chippenham Borough Council, Monkton Hill, Chippenham.

Objections to the Order must be sent to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London, S.E.1, by 1971, quoting the reference TTPA 5/9/02 and stating the reasons for objection.
