Proposed Stopping Up of Leach Square

COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

Aylesbury Rural District Council (Footpath No. 20 Weston Turville) Diversion Order 1970

Notice is hereby given that on the 23rd December 1970, the Aylesbury Rural District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way from Wendover Road to Worlds End Lane from a stile in the south-west corner of O.S. parcel 44 along the southern boundary of O.S. parcel 44 and then diagonally across O.S. parcel 45 to its junction with Worlds End Lane opposite Church Lane to a line running from the aforementioned stile along the northern boundary of O.S. parcel 39 to join Worlds End Lane 150 yards south-west of its present junction with the Lane.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at 84, Walton Street, Aylesbury, Bucks, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from 23rd January 1971, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the 24th December 1970, make an application for the purpose of the High Court.

BURTON UPON TRENT COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL
