NOTICE OF DESIGNATION OF LAND AS A CONSERVATION AREA

Staines Urban District

Land at Laleham

Notice is hereby given that the Surrey County Council in pursuance of section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act 1967, have designated as a Conservation Area the area described below:

Laleham Village

Commencing opposite Nos. 27 and 29 Ashford Road the boundary of the proposed Conservation Area runs in a southerly direction along the eastern side of Ashford Road as far as The Limes, where it turns east and south again to pass behind the properties facing The Broadway as far as the Village Hall. The line then runs almost due south for some 350 yards (320 m.) to Shepperton Road. It then passes along the eastern and southern sides of
