The extensions to the already designated area are considered to be areas of special achitec-tural or historic interest the character or appearance of which should be preserved or enhanced and will be the subject of stringent control of development. The County Council as Local Planning Authority intend to take such action as may be available to them to secure the preservation and general improvement of the areas.

(2) Castle Gate. That area from the existing designated area boundary adjoining 48 Castle Gate to 68, 68A Castle Gate as far as the passageway leading down to Town Lock and including Lock Entry Cottage.
