*Town and Country Planning Acts 1962 and 1968
Mineral Workings Act 1951*

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 and section 32 of the Mineral Workings Act 1951 to authorise the temporary stopping up for a period of seven years of a cart road designated as CRF 9, at Llanharry in the county of Glamorgan, to enable development consisting of open-cast coal works to be carried out by the National Coal Board.

The proposed Order will require the restoration of the stopped up cart road at the end of the period.

During 28 days from the 9th February 1971 copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Cowbridge Rural District Council Offices, Eastgate, Cowbridge and at the Clerk's Office, Llanharry Parish Council, 77 Birchgrove, Llanharry.
