*The Lothingland Rural District Council (Bridleway No. 8 (Part) Mutford) Public Path Diversion Order 1971.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 1st February 1971, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Lothingland Rural District Council.
