

to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1971 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order (and of the map referred to therein) may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Gosforth, Newcastle upon Tyne, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 11th February 1971.

Within the said period any persons who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area is bounded on the north side by the northern boundary of the urban district from its most westerly point thence in an easterly direction to a point where that boundary meets the fence line at the rear of the east side of Acomb Crescent, thence in a southerly direction along the said fence line to a point where that line meets Grange Lane, thence in a westerly direction along the line of the urban district boundary to its termination on the western boundary of the urban district, thence in a northerly direction along its west boundary to its junction with the northern boundary of the urban district.
