Petty Officer Medical Assistant Frederick James MacLaughlin D/MX864590.

On 27th June 1970 a company of 45 Commando Royal Marines was sent to deal with a gun battle between rival factions in the Crumlin Road area of Belfast. Petty Officer MacLaughlin accompanied them as medical assistant. After taking a wounded civilian to hospital, the ambulance he drove came under fire while returning to the scene of action. Petty Officer MacLaughlin was hit in the cheek. He refused help and, while bandaging the wound himself, heard that another civilian had been wounded. heard that another civilian had been wounded.

Completely disregarding his own injury, MacLaughlin drove through the line of fire to the wounded man and accompanied him to hospital. There the Petty Officer saw that the patient was cared for before consenting to be examined himself. It was found that a bullet had entered Petty Officer MacLaughlin's right cheek, smashed his lower jaw and lodged in his throat. He was immediately given

and rouged in his throat. He was infinediately given an emergency operation.

By his example of bravery and complete disregard for his own safety, Petty Officer MacLaughlin showed outstanding courage while evacuating the civilian casualties. His selfless conduct was an example to all who saw him and was in the highest traditions of the Service. of the Service.

To be an Additional Officer of the Military Division of the said Most Excellent Order, for Gallantry:

Lieutenant-Colonel Jack Spencer FLETCHER, M.B.E. (397244) The Queen's Regiment

Lieutenant-Colonel Fletcher's Battalion was involved in all the big riots and skirmishes in Belfast from the outset, and due to his leadership maintained

high morale despite casualties suffered.

On the night of 3rd July 1970 serious rioting broke out in the Falls Road area and the mob harassed broke out in the rails Road area and the mob harassed the troops with petrol bombs, grenades, other missiles and eventually small arms fire. At last light, the main body of the Battalion led a clearing operation and was met with concentrated and co-ordinated fire. The action lasted for about two hours and Lieutenant-Colonel Fletcher was conspicuous among

his forward troops, controlling and encouraging them with complete disregard for his own safety.

At a later date, a determined advance by Lieutenant-Colonel Fietcher's Battalion led to the clearance of an area in which 106 firearms, 20,750 rounds of ammunition and 25 pounds of explosives were seized.

Lieutenant-Colonel Fletcher's conduct throughout was highly professional; his control was colored.

was highly professional; his control was calm and resolute, his bravery, cheerfulness and endurance an inspiration to his men. It was courageous leadership far in excess of the normal call of duty, and its impact on the morale of the troops and police has been immense.

To be Additional Members of the Military Division of the said Most Excellent Order, for Gallantry:

Major Archibald Randall George Addison (433039) The Royal Scots (The Royal Regiment)

Major Addison commanded B Company of his Battalion during its four-and-a-half month tour in Belfast. At Ballymurphy on 31st March and on

1st April 1970 he led his men against overwhelming numbers of rioters who were throwing petrol bombs, bricks and other missiles. His courage and complete disregard for his own safety—despite serious injuries to his face and legs—inspired his company which suffered 25 casualties on the first night.

Three months later a large mob tried to break

through part of his Company, in Mayo Street. More petrol bombs and missiles were thrown at his men and a number of shots were fired by the mob. Major Addison again displayed outstanding courage while with his leading platoon, which drove off the rioters. On 3rd July 1970 Major Addison led a brilliant frontal assault against a barricade sheltering about 200 rioters. Under fire at close range from petrol bombs, grenades and small arms, his Company swept through the barricade and put the mob to flight.

Major Addison's courage and outstanding leadership

were an inspiration not only to his Company but to

the whole Battalion.

Lieutenant Nigel Alexander HINE (485746) The Cheshire Regiment.

At Londonderry on the evening of 27th June 1970 Lieutenant Hine led a series of baton charges by his platoon against a mob of 300 rioters who used petrol bombs, bricks and other missiles. Although wearing a helmet and visor he was struck in the face by a brick which broke his jaw and knocked out two teeth. Pausing only to allow a medical orderly to stem the flow of blood, Lietuenant Hine continued to command his platoon for the next nine hours although he was in great pain.

Through his leadership and courage he was instru-

Through his leadership and courage he was instrumental in ensuring the successful conclusion of the difficult and hazardous task given to his platoon.

Lieutenant David Christopher Leonard Jack (486672) The Royal Scots (The Royal Regiment)

On 3rd July 1970, Lieutenant Jack was commanding a platoon of his Battalion in the Falls Road area of Belfast where about 200 rioters held a formidable barricade of paving stones, earth, rubble and vehicles. Around 10 p.m. his platoon led a Company attack on the barricade which by that time had been saturated with oil and set alight. Lieutenant Jack led his platoon straight over the barricade and drove all before him. Although under fire from petrol' bombs and small arms fire he completely disregarded his own safety and by outstanding personal example galvanised his men to such determined and aggressive action that he was able to clear the road for 200 metres beyond the obstacle, and then prevent the oters from re-forming.

In all the riotous situations which faced his platoon

in Belfast, Lieutenant Jack always showed outstanding dash, determination and unhesitating willingness to take strong and immediate action. His conduct was in the highest tradition of the Service.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal for Gallantry (Military Division) to the undermentioned:

23939863 Corporal John Hugh Patrick Baseley, Corps of Royal Military Police.

At about 1 a.m. on 27th June 1970, Corporal Baseley was in charge of an unarmed patrol in the Creggan area of Londonderry, adjoining the Bogside where there was serious rioting at that time. where there was serious rioting at that time. He came upon a crowd surrounding a house on fire. Nobody was attempting to enter, but hearing that there were people inside Corporal Baseley doused himself with water and tried to go in by the front door. When flames and smoke beat him back, he tried again to enter by a bedroom window, using a ladder. An explosion in the house threw him to the grand the ground.

this time his clothes were virtually destroyed and he was in a state of shock. Nevertheless he made a third attempt, using a wet blanket for protection, and was in the house when firemen arrived, hosed him down and took him outside. He remained at the house until the fire was put out and then helped firemen in their search, finding the remains of four

Although in vain, his courageous conduct was an example of impartial and selfless humanity. It was

all the more praiseworthy since the mood of the spectators at the outset could have changed and put the safety of the unarmed patrol in jeopardy

23980958 Corporal (acting) Geoffrey GRAVES, The Queen's Regiment

On the night of 3rd July 1970, during rioting in the Falls Road area of Belfast, Corporal Graves repeatedly led his section forward against a hail of stones and other missiles including two hand grenades which exploded close to his men.

When his platoon came under snipers' fire and two men fell injured, Corporal Graves coolly took post behind a derelict lorry and engaged the gunmen, forcing them to keep their heads down until the

wounded had been moved to safety.

He then came under fire from a submachine gun
Undeterred, he whose bullets penetrated the lorry. Undeterred, he calmly indicated the snipers' position to the platoon which was thus able to engage them successfully. To locate the snipers, Corporal Graves moved his position several times, exposing himself to considerable risk.

Throughout the long action this young N.C.O.'s courage, leadership and presence of mind were an inspiration to his comrades.

23959750 Corporal Alexander McIntosh, The Royal Scots (The Royal Regiment).

On 3rd July 1970, Corporal McIntosh was in charge of a party detailed to clear a barricade of paving stones, rubble and vehicles in the Falls Road, Belfast, where bombing and shooting had broken out. Although met with petrol bombs, grenades and small arms fire, he led his men with vigour and determina-tion through a pool of burning oil and achieved the object. Later a mob of about 50 attempted a counter attack. Although stoned, petrol-bombed and under the threat of attack by grenades and small arms fire, his men held their ground and dispersed the mob which made no further attacks.

While holding the objective, Corporal McIntosh organised the collection and disposal of more than 100 petrol bombs from the area. In a dangerous, fast-moving situation he maintained absolute control and his determination and clear thinking contributed

much to the success of the overall operation.

In all the riotous situations in Belfast, Corporal McIntosh showed disregard for his own safety, outstanding determination, drive and initiative.

24064914 Staff Sergeant (acting) David Alan ORMEROD, The Queen's Regiment.

On 3rd July 1970, Sergeant Ormerod commanded a platoon of his battalion whose task was to clear hostile crowds from the Falls Road area of Belfast. On their second sortie one of their armoured vehicles was knocked out by a grenade which penetrated the petrol tank. Staff Sergeant Ormerod calmly re-formed

the platoon and, under a heavy barrage of missiles, including more grenades, secured the street so that the vehicles could be withdrawn.

Later in the action the platoon came under automatic fire from snipers. Staff Sergeant Ormerod regardless of his personal safety, directed his men in a fierce, hour-long gun battle which ended with the silencing of the snipers. At one stage he deliberately

nerce, nour-long gun battle which ended with the silencing of the snipers. At one stage he deliberately ran across the road and drew fire on himself so that his men could pinpoint the position of a sniper.

By his skill, courage and leadership in a series of actions, Staff Sergeant Ormerod saved the lives of several men and inspired his platoon to resolute

24040840 Private John Charles Powell, The Cheshire Regiment.

Private Powell was medical orderly with a platoon of his Battalion during rioting in Londonderry on 26th-27th June 1970. For about seven hours the platoon was constantly harassed by a crowd of up to 300 rioters and suffered a steady stream of casualties caused by stones, other missiles and petrol bombs. Private Powell, without helmet, visor or shield, which he had handed over to an unprotected soldier, went forward several times to bring in injured men.

went forward several times to bring in injured men. He was hit several times and early in the action was knocked to the ground. He recovered, and though in acute pain, continued to run the gauntlet and was felled a second time. This did not deter him, and his quick action saved an N.C.O. whose clothing was set alight by a petrol bomb; Powell himself extinguished the flames. He collapsed after about six hours and was moved to hospital where it was found that he had a severe fracture of the ankle.

Although in great pain and without regard to his own safety he did more than his duty. His was an act of sustained bravery.

24090846 Corporal Victor Michael Sullivan, The Queen's Regiment.

On the night of 3/4 July 1970, the 2nd Battalion The Queen's Regiment were deployed in the Falls Road area of Belfast to deal with serious rioting. Corporal Sullivan's platoon was ordered to secure a road junction and he took post in a doorway. He came under fire from several gunmen in the street opposite and in spite of several near misses

street opposite and in spite of several near misses calmly continued his job of reporting the location of snipers so that they could be engaged by the platoon. An hour later he again came under heavy fire from a quarter to which his post was completely exposed. Bullets struck the wall near him but he refused to leave the position until he had given his platoon commander a clear indication of the target which was then successfully engaged. Corporal which was then successfully engaged. Corporal Sullivan's coolness and presence of mind under fire were an inspiration to all, and his action undoubtedly saved the lives of comrades who were in a dangerously exposed positions.

23984377 Lance Corporal Anthony Paul BAUTENBACK, The Queen's Regiment

On 18 May 1970, Lance Corporal Bautenback was with a Company of his Battalion in the Ardoyne area of Belfast where gangs of youths were hurling petrol bombs and other missiles at the troops. Repeated charges were made by the Company and for several hours Bautenback and his comrades were under a hail of missiles and several were injured.

Again on 2 June, the Company was deployed in a similar situation in the Crumlin area.

In both actions Lance Corporal Bautenback was always to the fore and by his quick, decisive obedience

always to the fore and by his quick, decisive obedience aways to the fore and by his quick, decisive obedience to orders and complete disregard for his own safety set a magnificent example to all ranks. He was personally responsible for arresting five ringleaders and the brave conduct of this young soldier, who had completed his recruit training only a few months earlier, was an inspiration to all.

Second Lieutenant Michael Newton CARTER (487463), Royal Regiment of Artillery

During rioting in Londonderry, which continued for some 48 hours from the evening of 26 June 1970, Second Lieutenant Carter commanded a troop 1970, Second Lieutenant Carter commanded a troop of his Regiment with great effect. Although without sleep, often under severe strain and in considerable personal danger, he displayed high qualities of leadership and determination. At one time, on the second evening, he led a particularly gallant baton charge in which he was captured and severely beaten by the rioters before being rescued. Throughout the long action Second Lieutenant Carter displayed qualities outstanding in so junior an officer. He was a superb example and inspiration to all.

23782881 782881 Sergeant James Gloucestershire Regiment John Dalton, The James

On 3 July 1970, while commanding a platoon of his Battalion which came under fire in Belfast Sergeant Dalton sustained a deep cut in his right hand and a tendon of a finger was severed. During the next five hours, although in great pain, he continued to control his platoon in an exemplary manner. He refused on numerous occasions to be evacuated so that the wound could be tended.

Sergeant Dalton displayed outstanding conduct and personal bravery which had a most encouraging effect on the platoon. His endurance when in great pain, was in accordance with the highest traditions

of the Service.

3889773 Corporal John Gloucestershire Regiment 23889773 Ievan Davies, The

On 3 July 1970, Corporal Davies commanded a section of a Company of his Battalion holding back a rioting mob in Belfast. Time and again he led

his section against a fusilade of stones and, some-times, grenades and played an outstanding part in the successful outcome of the action.

ater he was made responsible for a road junction which was under continuous and accurate fire. He organised his men in fire positions, put out the street lights, and then manoeuvred himself forward so that he could engage the sniper and neutralise his fire. This action required him to expose himself

ontinually to the gunman's fire.

In both actions Corporal Davies showed outstanding courage and leadership and a complete disregard for his own safety. His exceptional steadiness was an inspiration to all.

24013561 Trooper Thomas William FISHER, 17th/21st Lancers

On the night of 3/4 July 1970, Trooper Fisher drove an armoured Saracen carrying men of the 2nd Bn. The Queen's Regiment in the Falls Road area of Belfast. When the vehicle came under heavy fire from snipers, Trooper Fisher engaged the gunmen with his submachinegun to such good effect that the infantry were able to dismount and deploy without suffering casualties. Fisher then manned the searchlight and continued to do so through the remainder of the night. On many occasions bullets aimed at the light came close to his head, but he remained at his post and gave invaluable support to the infantry. On the night of 3/4 July 1970, Trooper invaluable support to the infantry.

Trooper Fisher's coolness and courage under fire reflected the greatest credit on himself and his

regiment.

22567188 Warrant Officer Class I (acting) Gordon Francis Griffiths, Royal Regiment of Artillery

On 28 May 1970, as a Battery Sergeant Major Griffiths led a squad against a gang of youths who had assaulted a middle-aged civilian in Londonderry. The gang escaped into a hostile crowd which turned on the soldiers. As the squad disengaged, one N.C.O. was knocked to the ground and the mob began to beat and kick him. Sergeant Major Griffiths turned back to help and was himself severely injured, sustaining a fractured skull and extensive bruises. Nevertheless, his action saved the N.C.O. from worse injury and delayed the onslaught of the crowd for sufficient time for reinforcements to arrive and for the injured men to be recovered.

His action was applauded by local people as an example of the manner in which the Army helped to protect peaceful people from lawless hooligans, and his conduct was an inspiration to the Regiment.

Lieutenant Christopher Gordon Fleet MITCHINSON (479301), The Royal Scots (The Royal Regiment).

On 3rd July 1970, Lieutenant Mitchinson, on duty in Grosvenor Road, Belfast, with a patrol of three soldiers, saw a hostile crowd force the crew and soldiers, saw a hostile crowd force the crew and passengers off a double-decker bus. It was clear that the mob's intention was to drive the bus to Lower Falls, where a Company of The Royal Scots were under attack, and use it as a road block.

Without regard for his own safety, Lieutenant Mitchinson ran to the bus and boarded it. He was followed by about surety and the robot transport of the robot transport of

followed by about twenty of the mob who came between him and his three men. His first action was to force the man in the driving seat to leave by threatening him with his pistol. Then he was attacked by the angry crowd. Lieutenant Mitchinson fought free and, single-handed, evicted them from the bus. He then stood his ground for five minutes until help arrived.

His courageous and determined action marked the turning point of the action in Grosvenor Road. The rioters lost the initiative and order was quickly restored. Lieutenant Mitchinson set an outstanding example to all ranks of the effectiveness of swift action and unwavering determination.

23978271 Bombardier Geoffrey Murray, Royal Regiment of Artillery.

Lance Bombardier Murray, commanding a rifle section of his Regiment during rioting which began in Londonderry on 26th June 1970, consistently demonstrated qualities of leadership, courage and devotion to duty during a period of 48 hours in which he had under two hours' rest.

9th March 1971.

On the second night, when his troop commander vas captured after a baton charge, Bombardier Murray led two members of his section into the hostile crowd and rescued the officer and another soldier who had been knocked to the ground. Bombardier Murray demonstrated leadership and personal courage of a very high order.

Second-Lieutenant James Norman Cobbe Myles (488820), 'The Queen's Regiment.

On the night of 27th/28th June 1970, Second Lieutenant Myles commanded a platoon of his Battalion assisting the Royal Ulster Constabulary in the Ballymacarrett area of Belfast where rival factions numbering up to 1,000 persons were looting, burning and throwing petrol bombs. When trying to separate the factions, the platoon came under heavy fire and a petrol bomb set his own personnel carrier on fire Calmly, Second Lieutenant Myles called for an extinguisher and under a hail of shots and missiles tinguisher and under a hail of shots and missiles attempted to put out the flames. When this failed the ordered the vehicles to withdraw to cover where the fire was dealt with. On many occasions during a long night he exposed himself to fire, either to allow snipers to be located or to speak to local leaders. He led his men calmly and efficiently without regard for his own safety and the fact that the platoon suffered no casualties was due in large measure to his leader-

ship.
The conduct of this young officer, commissioned only four months earlier, was a credit to his Regiment.

23842367 Sergeant Ernest Brian POTTER, The Duke of Edinburgh's Royal Regiment (Berkshire and Wiltshire).

On 3rd July 1970, Sergeant Potter was with a platoon of his Regiment confronting a crowd of about 400 youths in Belfast who pelted them with ball bearings and other missiles and gelignite grenades. Sergeant Potter was wounded in the hand—a fractured finger and a deep cut—early in the action. In spite of pain he continued to organise and control repeated baton charges and, by his calm bearing, was able to steady the front rank under the hail of missiles and bring the action to a successful end. When his and bring the action to a successful end. When his wound had been tended, he remained with the platoon in the cordon of the Falls area for the remainder of the night and the following day. Sergeant Potter the night and the following day. Sergeant Potter displayed courage and devotion to duty and contributed greatly to the success of the operation.

1016808 Sergeant (acting) С REDMAN, The Queen's Regiment. Christopher Kevin

On the night of 18th May 1970, Sergeant Redman commanded a section of his battalion in the Ardoyne area of Belfast where gangs of youths roamed the streets hurling missiles and petrol bombs at the troops. Sergeant Redman was concussed by a blow but, undeterred, led his men into action and by his cool and courageous conduct inspired them to withstand a vicious barrage lasting several hours and to make a number of arrests. make a number of arrests.

On 2nd June, in the Crumlin Road area, Redman and his section faced a vicious hail of missiles which threatened the lives of the soldiers and wounded some of them. Once again this young N.C.O. displayed courage and leadership of the highest order and although injured on three occasions he refused to

leave his men.

Throughout these incidents Sergeant Redman showed complete disregard for his own safety and his leadership and courage were a credit to his regiment.

24121261 Lance Corporal George David Rogerson, The Gloucestershire Regiment.

On 3rd July 1970, Lance Corporal Rogerson was a member of a patrol which was ambushed in Belfast. The patrol commander and two other soldiers were hit by sniper fire. Although he was in pain from injuries by smper hre. Although he was in pain from injuries caused by stones thrown earlier in the day, Lance Corporal Rogerson, on his own initiative, took up a fire position at a street corner to assist the patrol to withdraw. He found that he was exposed to fire from a sniper. Nevertheless he remained there and neutralised the gunman's fire while the rest of the patrol moved back. Only when his task was completed did he consent to have his injuries attended. Throughout the whole of the action, Lance Corporal Rogerson showed outstanding courage and steadiness for such a young soldier. His conduct was

steadiness for such a young soldier. His conduct was an example to all who saw him.
