DRAFT SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Factories Act 1961

In pursuance of section 180 of, and Schedule 4 to the Factories Act 1961, the Secretary of State for

Employment hereby gives notice that he proposes to make special regulations imposing requirements as to guards and certain other safety devices for woodworking machines used in factories and certain other places to which the Factories Act 1961 applies. The Regulations will also impose requirements as to working space, condition of floors and temperature in those factories and places and requirements as to the training of persons operating woodworking machines. They will also prohibit the sale or letting on hire for use in factories and other places to which the Regulations apply of woodworking machines which do not comply with specified provisions of the Regulations as to guards and other safety devices.

Copies of the draft regulations which are entitled "The Woodworking Machines Regulations 1971" may be obtained from Her Majesty's Stationery Office at the addresses shown on the last page of this Gazette or through any bookseller.

Any objection to the draft regulations by or on behalf of persons affected must be sent to the Secretary of State on or before 13th May 1971.

Every objection must be in writing and state:

- the specific grounds of the objection; and
- the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS 1962 and 1968

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968, to authorise the stopping up of a length of Hill Street and two lengths of the Neath-Resolven Road (B.4434) at Melin Court, Resolven in the County of Glamorgan.
