Your Cheerfulness in giving such large Supplies at this Junture, and the ready Advances which have been made for their being Essethual, with so little Burden to the People, shew you perfectly understand how to make a right Use of Our past Successes, and that nothing is too Difficult for lo Dutiful and Affectionate Subjects, acting in Defence of so good a Gause.

My Lords and Gentlemen.

Her Majesty thro' the whole Course of Her Reign, having ever been desirous to shew all possible Instances of Goodness and Clemency to her Subjects, buth how for the strengthaing the Union, and Quieting the Minds of all Her Subjects, throughout the United Kingdom, thought fit to Grant them an Act of Grace and Free Pardon, in a more Full and Beneficial Manner than hath been formerly ujed; notidousting but all Her People will make a right Uje of; and suitable keturns on their part for so extraordinary an Indulgence.
