ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories QUEEN, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, To all to whom these Presents shall come

Greeting!

Whereas by Royal Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual dated the thirtieth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, We were pleased to institute and create a new Award entitled "The Queen's Award to Industry" and did make, ordain and establish certain rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these rules and ordinances or any part thereof, by a notification under Royal Sign Manual;

And Whereas it appears to Us expedient to make some alterations in the Second and Ninth Clauses of the aforesaid Warrant;

Now Therefore We do by these presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors declare and ordain that in the Second Clause of the said Warrant the words

"on their goods, packagings, correspondence and publicity material and on flags and plaques and on lapel badges, brooches, cuff links and neckties worn by members or employees of the recipient unit"

shall be substituted for the words

"on flags, plaques, lapel badges, note-paper, packaging or goods".

And We do further declare and ordain that the Ninth Clause of the Warrant shall be cancelled and annulled and the following substituted

Ninthly: The Award shall be granted in recognition of outstanding achievement by industrial units within Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Our Channel Islands and Our Island of Man, in exporting goods or services or in technological innovation or in both.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this twenty-ninth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-one, in the Twentieth Year of Our Reign.

for a period of five years from the twenty-first day of April 19... until the twentieth day of April 19... and do hereby give permission for the authorised flag of the said Award to be flown during that time by the said unit(s) and for the device thereof to be displayed upon letters and communications of the said unit(s) and upon its [their] packages and goods and in other ways in the manner authorised by Our Warrant of the thirtieth day of November 1965 as amended by Our Warrant of the twenty-ninth day of March 1971.

And We do further hereby authorise the said unit(s) during the five years of the currency of this Our Award further to use and display in like manner the flags and devices of any former such Awards by it [them] received. Given at Our Court at St. James's under Our Royal Sign Manual this
