

changes are that waiting will be prohibited on additional lengths of road as specified in the Schedule hereto.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein. An exception is also made for disabled drivers where limited waiting is in force.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan illustrating the proposal, may be inspected during all reasonable hours at the offices of the Hythe Borough Council at the Municipal Offices, Hythe, Kent.

SCHEDULE

1. *Seabrook Road*
 - (a) north side from a point 261 feet west of its junction with Horn Street to its junction with Cliff Road;
 - (b) south side, from a point 36 feet east of its junction with Victoria Grove to a point 188 feet west of that junction.
2. *Rampart Road*
 - (a) north and north-east sides, from a point 75 feet west of its junction with Stade Street to its junction with Red Lion Square and Chapel Street;
 - (b) south side, from a point 251 feet west of its junction with Stade Street to its junction with Red Lion Square.
3. *Red Lion Square*
 - (a) south side, from its junction with Rampart Road to a point 29 feet north-west of that junction;
 - (b) south side, from a point 85 feet west of its junction with the south side of Rampart Road to a point 124 feet west of that junction.
4. *Dymchurch Road*
 - (a) north side, from its junction with Military Road to a point 340 feet west of that junction;
 - (b) north side, from a point 95 feet east of its junction with Martello Drive to that junction.
5. *Military Road* south side, from its junction with Dymchurch Road to a point 133 feet west of that junction.
6. *Scanlons Bridge Road* west side, from its junction with Dymchurch Road to its junction with Military Road.

The Trunk Road (Liverpool Road, Kidsgrove) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1971

The Secretary of State for the Environment proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of this Order will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on certain parts of the Stoke-on-Trent—Lawton Gate Trunk Road (A.50), known as Liverpool Road, as follows:

- (a) The north side from a point 20 feet west of its junction with Heathcote Street to a point 200 feet east of that junction.
- (b) The south side from a point 15 feet east of its junction with Heathcote Street to a point 200 feet east of that junction.

This prohibition is an extension of those advertised on 1st January 1971.

INLAND REVENUE

STAMP DUTIES

Whereas section 12 (2) of the Finance Act 1899 provides that Her Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue may substitute, as respects any foreign or colonial currency mentioned in the Schedule to that Act, any rate of exchange for that specified in the Schedule and may add to the Schedule the rate of exchange for any foreign or colonial currency not mentioned therein, and that such Act shall be construed as if any rate of exchange for the time being substituted or added were contained in the said Schedule, and in the case of the substitution of the rate of exchange as if the rate for which the new rate is substituted were omitted from that Schedule; and whereas by notices duly advertised pursuant to the said section the said Commissioners have from time to time, and lastly by notice duly advertised in the month of July 1970 substituted certain rates of exchange for those contained in the Schedule, and have added thereto certain rates of exchange. Now therefore the said Commissioners do hereby give notice that they substitute the following rates of exchange for those contained in the Schedule to the Finance Act 1899 as varied by the above-mentioned notices.

Escudo (Chile)	29.6 to the pound
Krone (Denmark)	18.1 to the pound
Krone (Norway)	17.3 to the pound
