PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council
Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in Hadleigh Churchyard, in the County of Essex, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 10th day of February 1971, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134) and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in Hadleigh Churchyard, in the County of Essex, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.
