The Martley Rural District (Footpath Number 31, Wichenford) Public Path Diversion Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 7th June 1971, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the Martley Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of the public footpath at Lingers Farm in the Parish of Wichenford running from a point on the north side of the Broadheath-Newtown Road (C.66) approximately 170 yards east of the junction at Tinkers Cross in a north-easterly direction for approximately 100 yards. The new path will run from a point on the north side of the said Broadheath-Newtown Road approximately 210 yards east of the junction at Tinkers Cross in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 80 yards to the existing path.
