Pedestrianisation of Roads at Llanelli

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes, on the application of the County Council of Carmarthen, to make an Order under section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968 for extinguishing any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on those lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of those highways by vehicles being used:

- (a) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties if that vehicle cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road; or
- (b) in accordance with the special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the County Council of Carmarthen, the Borough Council of Llanelli or the Chief Officer of Police for the Dyfed-Powys Constabulary; or
- (c) where the vehicle is an invalid carriage (mechanically or hand propelled), a vehicle which has been issued to a disabled person by the Government in lieu of an invalid carriage, or a vehicle
