The Trunk Road (Cowbridge By-pass) (Access Road) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, prohibiting the driving of any vehicle in a north-westerly direction in that length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48), at Stalling Down in the County of Glamorgan, which forms an access road, and which extends from a point 185 yards south-east of the centre line of the bridge carrying the Llantwit Major—Newton Road (B.4270) over the Cowbridge By-Pass (A.48) in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 155 yards.

amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 6th July 1971, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order.
