ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967 Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 74 (1) for wates has made all order under section 74 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, prohibiting the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 40 m.p.h. on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

That length of the Dolgellau-South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A.494), which extends from a point 70 yards north-east of the centre of the bridge over the River Alun, at Loggerheads in the County of Denbigh, to a point 17 yards west of its junction with Maeshafn Road, at Gwernymynydd in the County of Eliver a distance of approximately 1266 yards of Flint, a distance of approximately 1,266 yards.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road (Llanidloes Road, Newtown) Order 1971

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 7 of the above Act providing:

- (a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Newtown in the County of Montgomery shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and
- (b) that the length of the Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the County Council of Montgomery (who will become the highway authority respon-sible for that length) that the trunk road is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the Order, the title of which is "The Newtown—Aberystwyth Trunk Road (Llanidloes Road, Newtown) Order 1971" (S.I. 1971 No. 1174) can be purchased, price 3p, either through any book-seller, or direct from any branch of Her Majesty's Entimetry Office

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff, where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours. Copies have also been deposited at the offices of the County Council of Montgomery, County Offices, Welshpool, where they are similarly open to inspection. Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to

are similarly open to inspection. Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 20th August 1971, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
