Pinner Fair

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on 1st and 12th May 1971 respectively, representations were duly made to him by the owner and by the Council of the London Borough of Harrow, that a Fair, known as Pinner Fair, has been held annually in the London Borough of Harrow on the first Wednesday after Whit Sunday, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that this Fair should in future be held annually on the Wednesday next following the last Monday in May.

On Tuesday, 12th October 1971, the Secretary of State will take such representations into consideration.

Any objection to the alteration of the date on which the Fair is held should be put in writing to the Under-Secretary of State, Home Office, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before 12th October 1971.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967
*The Trunk Road (Llanwrda) (One Way Traffic)
Order 1971*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is that no person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in a westerly direction in that length of the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (A.483), at Llanwrda in the County of Carmarthen, which extends from a point 163 yards east of its junction with the Llanwrda—Aberayron road (A.482) to a point 373 yards east of that junction.

Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), 139 Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1YU, quoting the reference number R 15/224/3.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from the 10th August 1971 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The M4 Motorway (Tredegar Park—St. Mellons Section) and Connecting Roads Scheme 1971

The M4 Motorway (Tredegar Park—St. Mellons Section) and Connecting Roads Scheme (Side Roads) Order 1971

The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Eastern Avenue and Cleppa Park Link Roads) Order 1971

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. A Scheme under section 11 of the above Act, authorising the Secretary of State to provide—

- (a) a special road as a Motorway from Tredegar Park to St. Mellons in Monmouthshire; and
- (b) two special roads as connecting roads between the above-mentioned Motorway and the existing roundabout at Tredegar Park and one special road between the existing M4 Motorway and the said roundabout

for the exclusive use of traffic of Classes I and II set out in Schedule 4 to the said act as amended by the Special Roads (Classes of Traffic) Order 1961 and providing for the special roads to become trunk roads on the date when the Scheme comes into operation; and

2. an Order under section 13 of the above Act which will

- (a) authorise the Secretary of State
 - (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
 - (ii) to stop up highways,
 - (iii) to construct new highways,
 - (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
 - (v) to provide new means of access to premises all on or in the vicinity of the routes of the above-mentioned special roads, and
- (b) provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the highway authority specified therefor in the Order as from the 1st April next after the date on which the Secretary of State notifies that authority that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

3. An Order under section 7 of the above Act providing that the roads which he proposes to construct at St. Mellons and Tredegar Park in the County of Monmouth shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation.

Copies of the draft Scheme and draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 7th September 1971, to 7th December 1971 at the Welsh Office, Roads Division, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff and at the offices of Monmouthshire C.C., County Hall, Newport; Magor and St. Mellons R.D.C., Baneswell, Newport; Newport County Borough Council, Civic Centre, Newport; St. Mellons Parish Council, 10 Eurwg Crescent, St. Mellons.

Any person may not later than 7th December 1971 object to the making of the Orders by notice to the Secretary of State at the Welsh Office, Roads Division, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1YU, quoting reference R11/230/6 and stating the grounds of objection.
