

## SCHEDULE 1

*Lengths and a side of a length of the Dolgellau—South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A.494) (hereinafter referred to as "The Trunk Road"), at Ruthin in the County of Denbigh.*

1. That length of the trunk road, known as Castle Street, which extends from its junction with Dog Lane to its junction with Upper Clwyd Street.

2. That length of the trunk road, known as Market Place, which extends from its junction with St. Peter's Square to its junction with that length of the trunk road, known as Well Street.

3. That length of the trunk road, known as Well Street, which extends from its junction with that length of the trunk road known as Market Place to a point 20 yards east of its junction with Wynnstey Road.

4. The north side of that length of the trunk road, known as Well Street, which extends from a point 20 yards east of its junction with Wynnstey Road to its junction with Station Road (B.5105).

5. That length of the trunk road, known as Well Street, which extends from its junction with Station Road (B.5105) to its junction with Llanfair Street (A.525).

*The Llangyfelach to North of Fforest Special Roads (Side Roads) Order 1971*

*The London—Fishguard Trunk Road and the Swansea—Manchester Trunk Road (Pontardulais By Pass Side Roads) Order 1971*

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under section 13 of the above Act which will:

- (a) authorise the Secretary of State:
- (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
  - (ii) to stop up highways,
  - (iii) to construct new highways,
  - (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
  - (v) to provide new means of access to premises all on or in the vicinity of the routes of the above mentioned special road, and

(b) provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the highway authority specified therefore in the Order as from the 1st April next after the Secretary of State notifies that authority that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

2. An Order under section 9 of the above Act which will:

(a) authorise the Secretary of State:

- (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
- (ii) to stop up highways, and
- (iii) to construct new highways all at Llanedy, Carmarthenshire, and Llangyfelach, Glamorgan, and

(b) provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the highway authority specified therefore in the Order as from the 1st April next after the Secretary of State notifies that authority that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.
