PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

BINGLEY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Bingley No. 17 (Central) Smoke Control Order, 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Bingley in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, on the 19th October 1971, made an Order entitled "The Bingley No. 17 (Central) Smoke Control Order 1971" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemption provided by the Order, and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before 1st April 1973, or before a later date to be determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Bingley, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 4th day of November 1971.

Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order, may, by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

That part of the Urban District shown coloured green on the map referred to, that is to say that part of the Central Ward bounded on the north-west by the centre of Park Road between the centres of the bridges over the Leeds and Liverpool Canal and the railway line, on the south-west by the centre of the railway line between Park Road and the boundary with the Bingley No. 12 (Gilstead) Smoke Control Order 1964, on the south-east by the boundary of such Order to its junction with the canal and on the north-east and north by the centre line of the Canal to the starting point.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order if, on any date after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of July 1973, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Clerk's Department, Council Offices, Swadlincote, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 11th November 1971.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SW1P 3EB, object to the confirmation of the Order.

NORTHERN GAS BOARD

THE GAS ACT, 1948

The Gas (Declaration of Calorific Value) Regulations 1949 and

The Gas (Declaration of Calorific Value) (Amendment) Regulations 1951

Whereas the Northern Gas Board, being an Area Board for the purpose of the Gas Act 1948 propose to commence to charge for gas supplied from the Gas Governor installation specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said gasworks") according to the number of therms supplied.

It is hereby declared by the aforesaid Board that the calorific value of the gas to be supplied from the said gasworks is 1017 British Thermal Units per cubic foot and that this Declaration shall take effect on and after the 5th February 1972.

For the purpose of calculating the charge to be made for gas supplied from the said gasworks to any consumer, this Declaration shall take effect immediately after the first reading of that consumer's meter which relates to the said gas and is on or after the said 5th February 1972.
