PRESENT

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 c. 73 and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Citation*

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) (Second Amendment) Order 1971.

*Interpretation*

2. The Interpretation Act 1889 c. 63 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

*General*

3. The revised rates of pay set out in the Schedules to this Order shall have effect from 1st August 1971 and shall be payable, subject to the regulations made by the Defence Council or the Admiralty Board on their behalf, in respect of Officers, Ratings and Other Ranks of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines and of members of the Naval and Marine Reserves while serving or training in Her Majesty's Ships or Establishments; the said rates shall not apply to Officers appointed for time only or otherwise holding Naval rank for purposes of status only or to personnel recruited abroad for local service. The rates in the Schedules shall be read as daily rates.

4. The provisions in Article 4 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) Order 1970 as to increments of pay for Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve and the Royal Marine Reserve shall apply to the rates of pay as revised by this Order.

5. (1) The Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) Order 1970 shall accordingly be amended, with effect from 1st August 1971, as follows:—

(a) for Schedule 1, there shall be substituted Schedule 1 to this Order; and

(b) In Schedule 2, there shall be substituted for paragraphs 1(b), 2(b), 3 to 7, 8(b) and 9 to 12, the corresponding paragraphs of Schedule 2 to this Order.

(2) The said Order shall be further amended, with effect from 1st April 1971, by deleting, in paragraph 8(a) of Schedule 2, the first three lines of the table there set out and by substituting the following:—
