THE CAPITAL GAINS TAX (EXEMPT GILT-EDGED SECURITIES) (NO. 3) ORDER 1971.

In accordance with section 41 (2) of the Finance Act 1969 the Treasury give notice that an Order entitled The Capital Gains Tax (Exempt Gilt-edged Securities) (No. 3) Order 1971 has been made under the provisions of that Act and section.

FACTORIES ACT 1961

The Secretary of State for Employment hereby gives notice that on 3rd November 1971 he made the Baking and Sausage Making (Christmas and New Year) Order 1971 under section 117 of the Factories Act 1961. This Order enables women, who have attained the age of eighteen, to be employed in England and Wales on the afternoons of Saturdays, 11th, 18th and 25th December 1971 and 1st January 1972, and on Sundays, 12th, 19th and 26th December 1971 and 2nd January 1972, in the manufacture of

meat pies, sausages or cooked meats, or in the pre-packing of bacon; and on the afternoons of Saturdays, 11th and 18th December 1971, and on Sundays, 12th and 19th December 1971, in the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery (including fruit pies but not biscuits).

This Order also enables women, who have attained the age of eighteen, to be employed in Scotland on the afternoons of Saturdays, 11th, 18th and 25th December 1971 and 1st January 1972, and on Sundays, 12th, 19th and 26th December 1971 and 2nd January 1972, in the manufacture of meat pies, sausages or cooked meats, or in the pre-packing of bacon; and on Sundays, 19th and 26th December 1971 in the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery (including fruit pies but not biscuits).
