

Wybersley Road to Dove House thence easterly and southerly along the boundaries of Dove House thus excluding the property, to the line of the Disley tunnel; thence easterly along the line of the Disley tunnel to the urban district boundary; thence north-easterly and northwards along the urban district boundary to the point where it crosses the River Goyt, thence in a general northerly direction along the line of the river to a point opposite the point where definitive footpath 78 crosses the Marple-New Mills railway thence westwards along definitive footpath 78 to the easterly boundary of No. 25 Strines Road; thence along the easterly and northerly boundaries of No. 25 Strines Road to Strines Road; thence southerly along Strines Road to Brickbridge Road; thence north-westerly along Brickbridge Road to the point of commencement.

CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

*The Sutton-in-Ashfield Urban District (No. 1)
Smoke Control Order, 1971*

Notice is hereby given that the Sutton-in-Ashfield Urban District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, on the 1st November 1971, made an Order entitled *The Sutton-in-Ashfield Urban District (No. 1) Smoke Control Order 1971*, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area which Order is about to be submitted to the Department of the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include, anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before 1st October 1973, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Department of the Clerk of the Council, Market Place, Sutton-in-Ashfield, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 19th November 1971.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area comprising approximately 470 premises and approximately 192 acres in size, bounded on the

northerly side by Mansfield Road, Skegby, from its junction with Forest Road to its junction with Dalestorth Road and by Skegby Lane from its junction with Dalestorth Road as far as the Sutton-in-Ashfield Urban District and Mansfield Borough Boundary and following this boundary in an easterly direction; on the easterly side by the Sutton-in-Ashfield Urban District and Mansfield Borough boundary in a south-easterly direction to its junction with Mansfield Road, Sutton-in-Ashfield; on the south-easterly side by Mansfield Road, Sutton-in-Ashfield in a south-westerly direction to its junction with the occupation road to Sutton Grange; on the south-westerly side by such occupation road in a north-easterly direction; on the south-easterly side in a south-westerly direction by the south-easterly boundary of Field No. 5117; on the south-westerly side in a north-westerly direction by the south-westerly boundary of Field No. 5117; on the south-easterly side in a south-westerly direction by the south-easterly boundary of Field No. 4411, continuing in a direct line across Field No. 3300, by the south-easterly boundary of Field No. 2989 and of the Vicarage, Skegby Road, to its junction with Skegby Road; on the westerly side of Skegby Road in a northerly direction to its junction with Dalestorth Street and Forest Road and by Forest Road in a northerly direction to its junction with Mansfield Road, Skegby.

OFFENSIVE TRADES

Declaratory Order

Section 107 of the Public Health Act 1936

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets intend to apply to the Secretary of State for the Environment, one month after the date on which this notice is published, for confirmation of an Order declaring the trades or businesses of Dresser of Poultry and Slaughterer and Dresser of Rabbits to be offensive trades in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets. If the Order is confirmed, it will prevent the establishment of any new trade of the kind mentioned without the Council's consent, and will give the Council greater power of making byelaws to regulate both new and existing trades of this kind.

Any objection to the Order may be made by letter addressed to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, London S.W.1, within one month.
