PRIVATE LEGISLATION PROCEDURE (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1936

Friends of the Clergy Corporation

Notice is hereby given in terms of section 1 (4) of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1936, that the Secretary of State, the Chairman of Committees of the House of Lords and the Chairman of Ways and Means in the House of Commons having or ways and wheans in the Frontse or Commons having considered representations by the Friend of the Clergy Corporation and the Poor Clergy Relief Corporation that it is expedient that the under-mentioned Parliamentary powers to be operative in Scotland and elsewhere which the Corporations desire to obtain should be conferred by one enactment have decided that the said payers regular program are recorded by the said payers. that the said powers would more properly be obtained by the promotion of a Private Bill than by the promotion of a Private Bill and of a Provisional Order under the said Act.

- 1. To amalgamate the Friend of the Clergy Corporation and the Poor Clergy Relief Corporation in a new corporate body and to provide for its incorporation on the 1st September 1972 by the name of the Friends of the Clergy Corporation (hereinafter refered to as "the Corporation") to define the objects and powers of the Corporation and to authorise subsequent variation of those objects and powers as if they formed part of a scheme and powers as if they formed part of a scheme brought into effect by order of the Charity Com-missioners under section 18 of the Charities Act 1960;
- 2. To transfer to the Corporation all property of the Friend of the Clergy Corporation and the Poor

Clergy Relief Corporation and to provide for the transfer of liabilities of those Corporations, the saving for agreements, deeds, actions, etc., and construction in favour of the new Corporation of bequests made in favour of either of the two transferring Corporations;

- 3. To confer a power to sell, mortgage, etc. lands, to provide for the application by the Corporation of the property funds and income of the two transferring Corporations and to enact provisions relating to the investment of funds of the Corporation and the establishment and maintenance of investment pools;
- 4. To authorise the Corporation to make regulations with respect to the management of the Corporation and the government and administration of its affairs including the holding of meetings, the appointment of officers and of a Committee of Management;
- To name the first President and Vice Presidents of the Corporation and officers and the members of its Committee of Management; and
