

The Urban District of Marple (No. 3) Smoke Control Order, 1971

All that area bounded by a line running from a point where Church Lane crosses the Macclesfield Canal in a southerly direction along the Macclesfield Canal towpath (definitive footpath No. 75) to a point opposite Shepley Lane, thence westwards along definitive footpath 75 to the urban district boundary; thence in a south-easterly direction along the urban district boundary to Torkington Lane; and continuing south-easterly along Torkington Lane to Windlehurst Road; thence in a south-westerly direction along Windlehurst Road to the property known as Windlehurst Fold thence easterly along definitive footpath 193 to the Macclesfield Canal; thence north-easterly to definitive footpath 187; thence generally south-easterly along definitive footpath 187 and definitive footpath 194 to Wybersley Road but excluding Lomber Hey House; thence northwards along Wybersley Road to Dove House thence easterly and southerly along the boundaries of Dove House thus excluding the property, to the line of the Disley tunnel; thence easterly along the line of the Disley tunnel to the urban district boundary; thence north-easterly and northwards along the urban district boundary to the point where it crosses the River Goyt, thence in a general northerly direction along the line of the river to a point opposite the point where definitive footpath 78 crosses the Marple-New Mills railway thence westwards along definitive footpath 78 to the easterly boundary of No. 25 Strines Road; thence along the easterly and northerly boundaries of No. 25 Strines Road to Strines Road; thence southerly along Strines Road to Brickbridge Road; thence north-westerly along Brickbridge Road to the point of commencement.

NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME BOROUGH COUNCIL

CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

The Newcastle-under-Lyme (Area No. 9) Smoke Control Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the mayor, aldermen and burgesses of the Borough of Newcastle-under-Lyme in the County of Stafford in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956 on the 5th day of November 1971 made an Order entitled "The Newcastle-under-Lyme (Area No. 9) Smoke Control Order 1971" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of a building within the Smoke Control Area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 31st day of December 1973 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Town Clerk, Civic Offices, Merial Street, Newcastle-under-Lyme aforesaid at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 1st day of December 1971.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

The area covering 147 acres is bounded and enclosed by the roundabout at A.34 junction with Knutton Lane, along Liverpool Road to Milehouse roundabout, Lower Milehouse Lane to Railway Crossing Apedale Mineral Line to Albemarle Road Bridge, south along Ashfields New Road to Knutton Lane

and east to its junction with the A.34 and comprising 1,034 premises.
