#### GOSPORT BOROUGH COUNCIL

##### *The Borough of Gosport (Traffic Regulation Orders) (Exemption for Disabled Persons) Order 1971*

Notice is hereby given that on the 15th November 1971, the Gosport Borough Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is that, as from the 1st December 1971, disabled persons vehicles, displaying a disabled persons badge, as defined by the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971, are exempted from traffic regulation Orders in the Borough which permit waiting for limited specified periods, i.e. where indicated by a broken yellow line. The exemption does not apply where there is a continuous single or double line prohibition in operation.

A copy of the Order may be seen in my Department at the Town Hall, High Street, Gosport, on weekdays (except Saturdays) between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks from the 15th November 1971, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

##### *Glamorgan County Council (Fontygary Road, Rhoose) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order, 1971.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th November 1971, the County Council of Glamorgan made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which will be:

(a) to limit the waiting of vehicles to 30 minutes, with return prohibited within one hour, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the southern side of that section of Route B.4265 known as Fontygary Road, Rhoose, from its junction with Station Road to its junction with Stewart Road, a distance of approximately 165 yards (150 metres) and,

(b) to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the northern side of that section of B.4265 known as Fontygary Road, Rhoose from a point opposite the junction with Station Road to a point opposite the junction with Stewart Road, a distance of approximately 165 yards (150 metres).

Exemptions will be provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works and the maintenance of essential services and funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office.

The Order will come into operation on the 12th day of November 1971, and a copy thereof, and a map showing the roads to which the Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff during normal office hours until the end of six weeks from the 12th November 1971.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act

or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from the 12th November 1971 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

##### *Glamorgan County Council (Marine Terrace, Porthcawl) (One-Way Traffic) Order, 1971*

##### *Glamorgan County Council (Slon Lane, Ogmoredy-Sea) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1971*

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th November 1971, the County Council of Glamorgan made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on both sides of Slon Lane, Ogmoredy-Sea, for a distance of approximately 410 yards, during the period commencing 1st May and terminating on 30th September, each year.
