The Upton upon Severn (No. 1 Post Office Lane, Kempsey) Public Footpath Diversion Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 22nd day of November 1971, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Upton upon Severn Rural District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert all that portion of footpath 19, being approximately 170 feet in length, which is described in the Register of Rights of Way as commencing at Footpath 14 and proceeding to the east of Bank House, in the parish of Kempsey, from a point in Post Office Lane, in the said parish.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, Upton upon Severn, Worcester, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary with the Order.
