Whitby Harbour
Objection to Harbour Charges

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, having considered the report of an inquiry held in Whitby on 13th October 1971 with respect to objections lodged with him by the Whitby Fish Selling Company to increases in wharfage charges

on all kinds of fish including shellfish and herrings imposed by the Whitby Urban District Council from 1st April 1971, has given to the Council the following direction under section 31 of the Harbours Act, 1964:

- (a) From 1st December 1971 the schedule of rates and charges which became operative from 1st April 1971 should be amended to show the rate payable on all kinds of fish including shellfish and herrings, as £0.28 in the £.
- (b) This direction shall have effect for a period of 12 months from the date on which the charges are reduced as provided above.
