The Queen has been graciously pleased, on the advice of Her Majesty's Australian Ministers, to approve the award of the British Empire Medal for Gallantry (Military Division) to the undermentioned:

Private GAGOLE-KEMANI, Royal Australian Infantry Corps.

During August and September 1971, B Company, Second Battalion, Pacific Islands Regiment, conducted a patrol through extremely rugged and difficult country from Lake Kopiago to Ambunti. On 13th September, when the company, of which Private Gagole was a member, was moving by rafts on the April River, a sudden flood swept down the river without warning, turning it, in a matter of seconds, into a raging torrent. Many of the company's rafts were carried along out of control, bouncing off rocks and fallen trees. The raft that Private Gagole was sharing with a fellow soldier, Private Deba, struck a tree stump lodged in the river bed causing the raft to capsize and forcing it into a violent whirlpool. Private Gagole was thrown into the water and managed to swim clear; however, his companion was trapped beneath the overturned raft. Realising this and disregarding his own safety and the hazards involved, Private Gagole swam back into the whirlpool, dived beneath the raft and into the whirlpool, dived beneath the raft and retrieved the drowning soldier, eventually bringing him through the turbulent water to the safety of the shore. Private Gagole's prompt and unselfish action undoubtedly saved Private Deba from death

Shortly after bringing Private Deba to safety, Private Gagole observed an unmanned raft containing the weapons and equipment of three other coldies being comised down the gives Without soldiers being carried down the river. Without regard for his own safety, he again threw himself

regard for his own safety, he again threw himself into the flood-waters, swam twenty metres through the swirling torrent to the raft and brought the weapons and equipment, which would otherwise have been lost, back to shore.

In the extremely hazardous conditions that prevailed on 13th September, Private Gagole, aged 18, demonstrated outstanding initiative and a sense of responsibility well above that expected of a private soldier of his age and experience. His personal bravery was an inspiration to all members of his company and his conduct was in the highest traditions of the Regiment and the Australian Army. Army.
