The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958.

viz: The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 2) Order 1972.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporarily exempt from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2 shall continue to be exempt from import duty, both until 1st January 1973, or in the case of certain items, until such earlier day as is specified.

As regards the exemption for equipment for use in aircraft under heading 85.15, apparatus of a type approved by the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry is listed in Civil Aviation Publication CAP 208, Airborne Radio Apparatus Vol. 2, published by Her Majesty's Stationery Office. This publication is subject to amendment, and confirmation that apparatus is of the type approved at the date of this Order should be obtained from the Department of Trade and Industry, Controllorate of National Air Traffic Services, Tels. N3 (b), 19-29 Woburn Place, London WC1H 0LX.

The Order comes into operation on 2 March 1972 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1972 No. 226.

viz: The Export Rebates (Appointed Date) Order 1972

This Order appoints 16th March 1972 as the date after which the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may pay the export rebate which will become due on goods exported under contracts certified under the Revenue Act 1968, notwithstanding that the conditions governing payment have not yet been fulfilled, if it appears to them to be practicable to determine the amount which will become due.
