Whereas it is expedient to provide for revised rates and conditions of award of retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and gratuities for Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, for Officers and Ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service and for Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pensions) (No. 1) Order 1972.
- 2. The provisions contained in this Order shall have effect from 1st April 1970.
- 3. The revised rates and conditions of award of retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and gratuities in respect of service in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Women's Royal Naval Service and Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service shall be as specified in the Schedules annexed hereto. Rates of half pay, retired pay and terminal grant for officers of Flag and General Rank have been varied from 1st January 1971.

SCHEDULE I

SECTION I

Half Pay and Terminal Grants for Admirals of the Fleet

1.—(a) An Admiral of the Fleet will be eligible during periods subsequent to 31st March 1970 for which he does not receive full pay, for half pay at the rate of £5,250 a year.

(b) An Admiral of the Fleet granted half pay and whose last day of service on full pay is 31st March 1970 or later, may be awarded a terminal grant of £15,750 free of income tax, in addition to his half pay.

An Admiral of the Fleet who has been awarded a terminal grant under this clause shall not be eligible for any further terminal grant on the conclusion of any subsequent period of full pay service.

Section II

Service Retired Pay for Permanent or Pensionable Royal Navy and Royal Marine Officers

2. The provisions of this Section relate to officers holding permanent or pensionable commissions in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, who retire from the Active List on or after 1st April 1970. Subject to the provisions. of the Forfeiture Act 1870 and the Admiralty Pensions Act 1921, they relate also to retired officers whose commissions are terminated or whose names are removed from the List of Retired Officers because of misconduct. They do not apply to officers holding temporary or short service commissions or officers on the Supplementary List who have not been granted permanent or pensionable commissions.

- 3. Retirement for age or non-employment. An officer retiring on or after attaining the age limit fixed for service in his rank and branch, or, it having been decided that further employment is not available for him, retired compulsorily before attaining that age limit, may be granted retired pay, provided that, unless the special provisions set out in Clause 7 are relevant, he has completed at least 16 years' reckonable service as defined in Clauses 28 to 32 below. In the event of eligibility for full pay continuing after formal retirement, the award will take effect from the day following that in respect of which full pay was last payable.
- 4. The rate of retired pay will be based on the officer's rank for retired pay purposes, as defined in Clauses 23 to 27, and on the length of his reckonable service calculated in accordance with Clause 32.
- 5. Rates of retired pay. Subject to the provisions of this Section, retired pay may be awarded at the following rates:
 - (a) General List, Medical, Dental and Instructor Officers and Special Duties List Officers (including Careers Service).

^{6.} When an officer's reckonable service exceeds a given number of years (up to and including 33 years) by one or more complete quarters of a year, his retired pay will be increased by that number of quarters of the difference between the rate for the number of years completed and the rate that would have been awarded had a further complete year been served.

^{7.} Late entrants. (a) If an officer was appointed to a permanent commission before 1st April 1960, at an age later than that of the normal entrant and, in consequence of his late entry, has not completed 16 years' reckonable service at the time of compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, as provided in this Section, retired pay may nevertheless be granted at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence provided he has completed at east 15 years' qualifying service.

(b) Retired pay will be awarded at the rate appropriate to 16 years' reckonable service with one deduction at the appropriate rate shown below for each year, and proportionately by quarters of a year, by which his reckonable service is less than 16 years:

8. Voluntary Retirement. An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service who retires at his own request on or after reaching the age of 40 years and before reaching the age of 50 years may be granted retired pay at the rates set out in Clauses 5 and 6 abated by 7½ per cent. At other ages the retired pay will be as indicated in Clauses 5 and 6.

An officer who has not served for at least 5 years after the grant of his permanent or pensionable commission will not be eligible for retired pay on voluntary retirement but may be awarded any service pension or gratuity for which he may be eligible by virtue of rating's service.

- 9. Invaliding. (a) An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service will, on invaliding, be granted retired pay at the rate set out in Clauses 5 and 6.
- (b) Officers invalided with less than 16 years' reckonable service, but with at least 10 years' qualifying service, will be eligible for an award of retired pay calculated as the proportion of the appropriate 16 year rate which their reckonable service, measured in complete periods of 3 months, bears to 16 years.
- 10. Retirement for Incapacity, Unsuitability, or Inefficiency. (a) Not within an officer's control. An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or for inefficiency, not due to causes within his own control, and having at least 16 years' reckonable service, may be granted retired pay as for a compulsory retirement on account of non-employment.
- (b) Within an officer's control. An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency due to causes within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, and having at least 16 years' reckonable service, may be granted an award of retired pay at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, but not in any event exceeding the rate which would have been admissible had he retired voluntarily.
- 11. Retirement, etc. for misconduct. (a) An officer who is retired for misconduct with at least 16 years' reckonable service, may be granted retired pay at such rates as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.
- (b) Dismissal, etc. An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service who is dismissed the Service or dismissed with disgrace by sentence of Court Martial or whose name has been removed from the List of Officers or who has been allowed to resign his commission to avoid trial by Court Martial, may be granted a compassionate allowance at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.
- 12. The Secretary of State for Defence may, in the exercise of his discretion under Sub-Clause 10(b) and Clause 11, grant a gratuity, or compassionate gratuity, in place of retired pay or compassionate allowance.
- 13. Special rules relating to officers promoted from the lower deck. An officer promoted to a permanent commission while serving on a normal regular engagement may on retirement be granted either:
 - (a) Retired pay under the conditions set out in this Section, or
- (b) Retired pay under the current rules for the award of ratings' pensions; whichever is more to his advantage.

SECTION III

Terminal Grants in Addition to Service Retired Pay

- 14. An officer retired from the Active List on or after 1st April 1970 and awarded retired pay under Section II of this Schedule, may be awarded a terminal grant, in addition to his retired pay, under the following conditions:
 - (a) The standard rate of grant will be three times the annual amount of the retired pay awarded under Section II of this Schedule.
 - (b) Except as provided in Clause 6 of Schedule III, an officer can qualify only once for a grant.
 - (c) The grant will be free of income tax.
- 15. A terminal grant under Clause 14 shall not be admissible in the case of an officer to whom Clause 11(b) applies, but a tax-free compassionate grant not exceeding three times the annual amount of the compassionate allowance may be awarded at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.
- 16. In the event of eligibility for full pay continuing after formal retirement, payment of terminal grant will not be made before the day following that in respect of which full pay was last payable.

SECTION IV

Service Gratuities for Permanent Officers (other than Officers on the Special Duties List) and for Officers holding Pensionable Commissions on the Supplementary List

- 17. Permanent officers, other than those on the Special Duties List, and Pensionable Supplementary List Officers may on retirement on or after 1st April 1970 if ineligible for service retired pay, be granted a gratuity as follows:
 - (a) On compulsory retirement for age or non-employment or on retirement at own request, with at least 10 years' qualifying service:

For the first 10 years' qualifying service £1,720
For each further year's qualifying service an addition of £345

An officer who has not served for at least 5 years after the grant of his permanent or pensionable commission will not be eligible for a gratuity on voluntary retirement but may, if he had previous rating service, be awarded any gratuity for which he may be eligible under the conditions relating to the award of gratuities to ratings.

- (b) On invaliding with less than the 10 years' service required to qualify for retired pay, a gratuity at the rate of £290 for each complete year of qualifying service.
- (c) If retirement on account of incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within his control:
 - (i) If with 10 or more years' qualifying service, a gratuity at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence not exceeding the amount which would have been admissible under sub-paragraph (a) above.
 - (ii) If with less than 10 but not less than 2 years' qualifying service, a gratuity at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence not exceeding £140 for the first 2 years' qualifying service with additions at the rate of £140 for each additional complete year of qualifying service.
- (d) If retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency or other cause within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity of such amount as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, but not in any event exceeding the amount which would have been admissible under sub-paragraph (a) above had the officer retired at his own request.

(e) If retired for misconduct, or on termination of commission for any of the reasons set out in Clause 11(b), with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity, or a compassionate gratuity, if the Secretary of State for Defence so decides and of such amount as he may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had the officer retired at his own request.

SECTION V

Service Gratuities for Permanent Officers on the Special Duties List

18. If permitted to retire at their own request, on or after 1st April 1970 with insufficient service to qualify for retired pay, officers on the Special Duties List may be granted gratuities on the following scale, subject to the completion of a minimum period of 12 years' actual service from the age of 18:

- 19. An officer with sufficient service to qualify for an award of retired pay, or for an award of pension on ratings' scales (with special increments for service as an officer), will not be eligible for an alternative award of gratuity on the foregoing scale.
- 20. If retired on or after 1st April 1970 for misconduct, or on termination of commission for any of the reasons set out in Section II Clause 11(b) of this Schedule, with at least 12 years' actual service from age 18, a gratuity or a compassionate gratuity may be allowed at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible under Clause 18 had the officer retired voluntarily.
- 21. An officer who has served on a rating's engagement, conferring eligibility for a rating's gratuity on completing at least 10 years' service after age 18, will have a reserved right to an award under Clauses 18 and 20, on completion of 10 years' such service instead of 12 years.
- 22. If invalided with less than 10 years' qualifying service and with insufficient service to qualify for pension on the ratings' scale, a gratuity at the rate of £245 for each complete year of qualifying service may be granted.

SECTION VI

Rank for Retired Pay Purposes

23. Subject to the following Clauses, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the substantive rank held by the officer on his retirement, provided that, unless the officer is invalided, the rank had been held on the Active List for the following minimum periods:

If the substantive rank has been held for less than the period specified the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the highest substantive rank which (with periods spent in higher substantive rank) satisfies the condition.

24. Service as Acting Captain, Royal Navy, may be reckoned towards the requirement of 6 years' service as Captain irrespective of the date of substantive promotion.

Additions to Retired Pay for Service in Paid Acting Rank

- 25. Subject to the general conditions in Clause 26 below, paid acting and temporary rank held by officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Women's Royal Naval Service and members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service may reckon for increase of retired pay as follows:
 - (a) For each complete year (subject to a maximum of 3) for which the paid acting or temporary rank was held, there may be added one-third of the difference between the retired pay for which the officer is eligible and the retired pay for which he would have been eligible had his rank for retired pay been one rank above his substantive rank.
 - (b) Where an officer has failed to complete 2 years in a substantive rank required to qualify him for the retired pay of the rank such service may reckon for retired pay as if it had been acting or temporary rank.
 - 26. General Conditions. (i) Service from 3rd September 1939, will count.
 - (ii) In no case shall service in an acting or temporary rank earn a rate of retired pay higher than would have been earned if the acting or temporary rank had been substantive.
 - (iii) The "complete years" referred to in sub-Clause 25(a) need not be continuous in time but may be made up of broken periods.
- 27. The Secretary of State for Defence may fix a date after which periods in acting or temporary rank will no longer be reckonable for additions to retired pay.

DEFINITIONS OF SERVICE

- 28. The following periods may be included in assessing qualifying and reckonable service for the purpose of the foregoing Clauses:
 - (a) Subject to Clause 31, full pay service (including mobilised or embodied service or for the purpose of training) as an officer, rating or other rank of the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army or the Royal Air Force or of the Auxiliary and Reserve Forces, and of the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or of the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth or a Colony, provided that where appropriate such service would be reckonable as qualifying service under Army or Royal Air Force regulations; except broken periods each of less than 6 months' duration.
 - (b) While a permanent regular officer, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Votes which the (o) write a permanent regular officer, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Votes which the Secretary of State for Defence considers can reasonably be regarded as part of an officer's career as such. They shall be appointments to which the officer brings his naval knowledge and from which he acquires additional experience and which have been officially offered to him as part of his naval service.
 (c) Periods before 1st August 1938, on unemployed pay, or on half pay not following the sentence of a Court Martial or the expiration of full pay sick leave, will reckon as service in full up to a maximum of 6 months in any one period or 2 years in all. Any such service not reckoning in full under the above rule will reckon as a third, subject to a maximum of 6 years such service reckoning as two years.
 - as a third, subject to a maximum of 6 years such service reckoning as two years.
- 29. Loss of seniority or time forfeited by sentence of Court Martial or Disciplinary Court will not involve loss of service for retired pay or gratuity.

30. Service preceding a five-year interval in service shall not be included unless specially allowed by the Secretary of State for Defence, and eligibility to reckon such previous service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. Where, during a break in service the officer has been a member of the Royal Naval Reserve, or other reserve of any of the Forces, undertaking or liable for periodical training, the period of such membership will not be considered an interval in service for the purpose of deciding whether the previous service is admissible.

PREVIOUS SERVICE FOR WHICH A NON-EFFECTIVE AWARD HAS BEEN RECEIVED

- 31. (a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the officer received a service gratuity, or in any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, or the Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for allowing such service to reckon for retired pay, that the officer shall make a payment to Naval Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise. In default of such payment as may have been stipulated, the previous service will not be allowed.
- (b) If an officer has continued to draw concurrently with full pay the retired pay or other analogous award payable in respect of previous service, the further service will normally not confer eligibility for improved benefits on final termination of employment.

COUNTING OF SERVICE

- 32. (a) Reckonable Service. All service as defined above from the age of 21 will count in full as reckonable service.
 - (b) Qualifying Service. All service as defined above from the age of 18 will count in full as qualifying service.

SCHEDULE II

SECTION I

Gratuties for Short Service Medical and Dental Officers

- 1. An officer entering the Medical or Dental Branches of the Royal Navy on a short service commission of 3 or 5 years' duration on or after 1st May 1961, may, if the full period of Active List service he has undertaken is satisfactorily completed, be awarded a gratuity at the rate of £500 for each of the first 3 years' service and at a rate of £750 a year thereafter. An officer entered on a 3-year commission who has applied before 1st September 1963, to extend his service by 2 years will be eligible for a gratuity of £3,000. Those applying for such extensions on or after 1st September 1963, irrespective of whether their original 3-year commission began before or after that date, will be eligible only for a gratuity of £2,500 on completion of 5 years' service. An officer entered on a 3-year commission who could, by a 2 year extension of service, qualify for a gratuity of either £3,000 or £2,500 may, if his further service beyond 3 years falls short of 2 years, be awarded an addition to his gratuity at the rate of £300 a year in respect of his further service. Officers permitted to extend their service beyond 5 years, and whose extension of service begins on or after 1st April 1968, will be eligible for an addition calculated at the rate of £400 a year for service in excess of 5 years. Otherwise the addition for further service beyond 5 years will be calculated at the rate of £300 a year. rate of £300 a year.
- 2. Women Medical and Dental Officers leaving on marriage or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retirement may be awarded a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List Service actually completed.

SECTION II

Gratuities for Supplementary List Aircrew and Electrical Officers other than those granted Permanent or Pensionable Commissions

3. Supplementary List Aircrew Officers may, on satisfactory completion of 12 years' service on the Active List on or after 31st March 1970 be granted a gratuity of £5,000 unless they have received the Aircrew Special Bounty as provided for in Order in Council of 29th October 1965, when they may be granted a gratuity of £4,000. Extension of service beyond 12 years will qualify for an addition at the rate of £500 a year.

Those who retire on or after 1st April 1970 on completion of 8 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £2,190. Helicopter Pilots retiring on or after 1st April 1970 on completion of 5 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,275.

- 4. Supplementary List Electrical Officers entered on or after 6th February 1964 who hold a degree, or degree equivalent, in electrical engineering (or in science with suitable engineering subjects); or are Graduate Members of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or the Institution of Electronic and Radio Engineers, or who hold qualifications which approximate to, or which exempt them from Parts I and II of the Institution of Electrical Engineers' examination may, on satisfactory completion of 10 years' service on the Active List, be granted a gratuity of £3,500. Those who leave on completion of 5 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,275.
- 5. Electrical Officers entered before 6th February 1964 and retiring on or after 1st April 1970 will be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £255 a year except that officers holding the professional qualifications laid down in Clause 4 who on 6th February 1964 had completed less than 5 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £3,500 on completion of 10 years' service.

SECTION III

Gratuities for Supplementary List Aircrew serving on Pensionable Commissions

6. Supplementary List Aircrew serving on pensionable commissions to age 38, who leave at their optional breakpoints, will be eligible for gratuities calculated in accordance with Clause 3 above. If they leave at any time other than at their optional breakpoints any award of retired pay or gratuity will be assessed in accordance with the provisions of Schedule I.

SECTION IV

Gratuities in respect of other Short Service Commissions

- 7. An officer holding a Short Service Commission or a Commission on the Supplementary List in the Royal Navy under terms which provide for the payment of gratuity may, on satisfactory completion on or after 31st March 1970, of the service, including any extension of service he has undertaken, be granted a gratuity at the following annual rates:

(a) Air Traffic Control Officers

£255 except that service below the rank of Acting Sub-Lieutenant will reckon only at the rate of £180 a year.

(b) Other Officers including Helicopter Pilots, but excluding Pilots and Observers of fixed wing

... £255.

SECTION V

General conditions attaching to the award of Short Service Gratuities

- 8. Should the officer fail to complete the full period of Active List service which he has undertaken, an award may nevertheless be made as follows:
 - (a) If his service is terminated on account of disability not due to causes within his own control, he will be granted a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he has actually completed.

- (b) If his service is terminated for non-employment, or for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within his own control, or if he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service within 6 months of the completion of the full period of Active List service he has undertaken, he may be awarded either a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he has actually completed or a reduced gratuity at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine.
- (c) If he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service more than 6 months before the conclusion of the period he has undertaken no gratuity will be payable to a Pilot or Observer unless he has completed at least 18 months' satisfactory service and is in possession of the flying badge, nor to an officer of any other Branch unless he has completed at least 1 year's satisfactory service. Thereafter he may be allowed, at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding three-quarters of the amount proportionate to the length of his actual service on the Active List.
- (d) If his service is terminated owing to disability due to causes within his own control or to inefficiency or other cause within his own control but not amounting to misconduct, he may be allowed, at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding the amount which would have been admissible had he been allowed to terminate his service voluntarily.
- (e) If his service is terminated on account of misconduct, the special payment of a compassionate gratuity shall be within the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence according to the circumstances of his case, but the award will not in any event exceed 90 per cent. of the gratuity which would have been admissible had he left voluntarily.
- (f) In the case of aircrew officers proportionate gratuity will be calculated as follows:

 (i) For service short of 8 years:
 For the first 18 months' service at the rate of £190 a year. For service beyond the first 18 months at the rate of £295 a year, subject to a maximum of £2,190.

 (ii) For service between 8 and 12 years £2,190 in respect of the first 8 years and at the rate of £705 a year for the remaining period subject to a maximum of £5,000.
- (g) In the case of Professionally Qualified Electrical Officers proportionate gratuity will be calculated as follows:
 - At the rate of £255 a year for the first 5 years and at £445 a year in respect of service between 5 and 10 years.
- 9. No part of a short service gratuity will be payable to the officer's estate or otherwise in the event of his death before completion of the period of Active List service he had undertaken.
- 10. If an officer serving on a short service commission continues on full pay beyond the period of Active List service which he had undertaken, payment of the gratuity will be deferred until the end of such further service.
- 11. A short service commission officer who is granted a permanent commission will not be eligible for any gratuity in respect of his service on a short service commission, but his service on that commission may count towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer. If, after receipt of a gratuity in respect of short service, an officer is granted a permanent commission his previous service will not be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer, unless satisfactory arrangements are made for the refund of the short service gratuity.
- 12. Service on a short service commission in the medical, dental, or education branches of the Royal Navy 12. Service on a short service commission in the medical, dental, or education branches of the Royal Navy may, in certain circumstances, be treated as contributory service under the National Health Service (Superannuation) Regulations or under the Teachers' (Superannuation) Act, as appropriate. Where service is so treated, both the employer's and the officer's contribution will be advanced by the Ministry of Defence and the total amount so advanced will be deducted from the gratuity for which the officer is eligible under the provisions of this Section. When contributions have been so advanced but as a result of being transferred to a permanent or pensionable commission the officer does not qualify for a gratuity under this Section, no refund of the employer's contribution will be required from the officer, but in order that his previous service may be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer he will be required to refund the employee's contributions advanced on his behalf by the Ministry of Defence. Service which counts for service retired pay or gratuity may not also count as reckonable service for purposes of pension under the appropriate civil superannuation scheme.

SCHEDULE III

SECTION I

Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines Re-employment in Peace-time

- 1. Except as provided in Section II an officer who is on retired pay may, while re-employed for training or on any authorised naval duty for periods not exceeding 6 consecutive months or aggregating 6 months or less in any 12 months, continue to draw his retired pay concurrently with any pay to which he is entitled; but payment of retired pay may be suspended when there is doubt about the duration of the period of re-employment. No retired pay will be payable when the period of re-employment exceeds 6 months, and where the retired officer has commuted any part of the retired pay which would have been liable to suspension had he not commuted, a deduction equivalent to the amount commuted will be made from his pay.
- 2. An officer whose service retired pay has been suspended under Clause 1 and who, having been placed on the Retired List before 1st April 1970 is re-employed on or after that date without an actual break in service, will be eligible on reversion to the Retired List for awards of retired pay and terminal grant under the provisions in Schedule I, Section II and III as appropriate for officers retiring on or after 1st April 1970 assessed on the basis of former pervices added to re-employed service. of former service added to re-employed service.
- 3. An officer whose service retired pay has been suspended under Clause 1 and who, having had a break in service, is in re-employment on or after 1st April 1970 may receive on reversion to the Retired List an award of retired pay assessed on the basis of former service added to re-employed service as follows:
 - (a) Under the provisions of Schedule I, Section II, provided that
 - (i) the period of re-employment is not less than 3 years; or
 - (ii) the officer is invalided from re-employment; or
 - (iii) he originally retired on or after 1st April 1970,
 - (b) If the officer originally retired before 1st April 1970 and the period of his re-employment is less than 3 years and he is not invalided, under the provisions of the Order in Council under which his retired pay was originally assessed.
- 4. If during re-employed service an officer has served in a rank higher than that held before original retirement and has received the pay and allowances appropriate to that rank, this service may be allowed to reckon for assessment of a revised rate of retired pay on a similar basis to that laid down in Schedule I, Section VI, Clauses 25 and 26.
- 5. If the officer had originally retired at his own request, re-assessed retired pay under either (a) or (b) above will be on the basis of voluntary retirement, unless he is invalided from re-employment.

- 6. An officer whose retired pay has been suspended under Clause 1 may receive, on reversion to the Retired List on or after 1st April 1970 terminal grant or additional terminal grant calculated as follows:
 - (a) If retired pay has been re-assessed under Sub-Clauses 3(a)(i) or 3(a)(ii) above, the award shall be, for each complete year of re-employed service, one-tenth of the difference between 3 times the annual amount of retired pay awarded on termination of re-employment and the terminal grant (if any) previously awarded.
 - (b) If retired pay has been re-assessed under Sub-Clause 3(b) above, and the officer originally retired before 1st January 1956, as in Sub-Clause (a) above.
 - (c) If retired pay has been re-assessed under Sub-Clause 3(a)(iii), or under Sub-Clause 3(b) above where the officer originally retired on or after 1st January 1956, the difference between the terminal gravet previously awarded and 3 times the amount of retired pay awarded on termination of re-employment.
- 7. An officer who originally retired at his own request with a gratuity only, may receive an additional gratuity of £255 for each completed year of re-employed service.
- 8. An officer who re-enters the Service within 5 years of being discharged on redundancy will be required to refund a portion of the Special Capital Payment awarded to him as follows:

SECTION II

Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines: Re-employment in Emergency

- 9. On recall for service at a time of imminent national danger or of great emergency, or when re-employed with the armed forces on general mobilisation, one-half of the retired pay of a retired officer will remain in issue concurrently with the pay and allowances appropriate to his rank on re-employment. Any portion of the retired pay that has been commuted will be recovered from the retired pay remaining in issue, or, when this is insufficient to meet the liability, from his pay to the extent of the deficiency.
- 10. For the purpose of applying the provisions of Clause 8 to a retired officer compulsorily recalled at a time of national emergency when general mobilisation has not been announced, the operative period will be determined by the Secretary of State for Defence in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service.

SCHEDULE IV

Officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service

(Note—For the general purposes of the regulations in this Schedule, the term "Officer" shall include a member of the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.)

1. Except as otherwise provided in this Schedule, officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service (W.R.N.S.) and members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service (Q.A.R.N.N.S.) holding appointments in the Permanent Service who retire from the Active List on or after 1st April 1970 may be granted retired pay or gratuities under the general conditions applicable to officers of the Royal Navy holding permanent regular commissions as prescribed in Schedule I, Section II. The rates will be 87 per cent. of the rate for men officers of equivalent rank as indicated below.

- 2. The general conditions in Schedule I, Sections III, IV, VI (as amplified in Clause 7 below), Section V of Schedule II and Sections 1 and II of Schedule III will also apply to officers except as provided in Clauses 4 to 6 following.
- 3. Retirement on marriage, or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retirement or termination of service, on or after 1st April 1970 to be treated as compulsory retirement for purposes of awards of retired pay.
- 4. Gratuities for Third Officers, W.R.N.S. retired compulsorily after 7 years' service. Third Officers, W.R.N.S. who are retired compulsorily for non-employment on completion of 7 years' service in the rank will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,552 19s. 0d. (£1,552 95).
- 5. Gratuities for Officers on short service engagements. (a) W.R.N.S. Officers. W.R.N.S. Officers granted short service commissions and who satisfactorily complete a 7-year commission on or after 31st March 1970 will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,552 19s. 0d. (£1,552 95). On optional withdrawal after satisfactorily completing 5 years' service on a short service commission, they will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,109 5s. 0d. (£1,109 25).
- (b) Nursing Sisters. Nursing Sisters entered for short service will, on satisfactorily completing the period of service undertaken, be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £221 17s. 0d. (£221.85) for each year of short service.

- 6. Gratuities for permanent and short service officers leaving on marriage or for compassionate reasons'
 (a) Permanent officers who have completed at least 4 years' service as officers and who, being ineligible for retired pay or for gratuities under the provisions of the foregoing Clauses, are permitted to retire or are required to terminate their service on marriage, or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons, necessitate retirement or termination of service, on or after 1st April 1970 may be awarded a gratuity of £150 for each complete year of qualifying service subject to a maximum of £1,496.
- (b) Short service officers whose service is terminated for the reasons stated in the preceding Sub-Clause will be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £221.85 a year proportionate to the length of short service commission actually completed.

The minimum of 1 years' service stipulated in Sub-Clause 8(c) of Section V of Schedule II may be disregarded for purposes of awards under this Sub-Clause.

7. Definitions of service of permanent officers. Within the limits prescribed on Clause 32 of Schedule I, and except as provided in the modified regulations set out in Clause 6 above, all full-pay service as an officer of the W.R.N.S. or as a member of the Q.A.R.N.N.S. or Q.A.R.N.N.S. Reserve or service as a rating in the W.R.N.S. may be taken into account in assessing qualifying and reckonable service for the award of retired pay and gratuities, as may service that would be treated as qualifying or reckonable service under Army and Royal Air Force Regulations.

SCHEDULE V

- 1. The provisions of this Schedule to apply only to officers serving under the terms and conditions laid down in Order in Council (No. 96/CE) of 23rd July 1931, and subsequent amending Orders in Council, who retire from the Active List at their own request before reaching the age of 45 in order to accept appointments in or under the Naval Ordnance Inspection Division of the Weapons Department of the Ministry of Defence (Navy Department) as members of the Works Group (Variant) Class of the Home Civil Service.
- 2. Such officers to be eligible from the date of their retirement from the Active List for awards of retired pay and terminal grant at the rates and under the conditions in force at the time of their retirement for officers on the General Active List who are retired compulsorily for age or non-employment; but not for any increase that might otherwise be payable in respect of service in acting and temporary rank under Clauses 25 to 27 of Section VI of Schedule I.
- 3. An officer who, having retired from the Active List under the foregoing Clauses, voluntarily terminates his service in or under the Naval Ordnance Inspection Division within three years of taking up an appointment as a member of the Works Group (Variant) Class thereupon to have his retired pay reduced to the rate that would have been payable, less any part commuted, at the time of his retirement from the Active List had that retirement been treated as though it were that of an officer on the general Active List retired at his own request; and to refund to the Ministry of Defence:
 - (a) the difference between the higher and lower rates of retired pay in respect of the period during which the former was in payment; and
 - (b) the difference between terminal grants based on the higher and lower rates of retired pay.

Payment of retired pay to be discontinued until arrangements satisfactory to the Ministry of Defence have been made for refund of the amounts due.

SCHEDULE VI

- 1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to ratings of the Royal Navy, other ranks of the Royal Marines, ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service who give service on full pay on or after 31st March 1970. They do not apply to R.N. Locally Entered ratings other than Maltese. The rates of pension are effective from 1st April 1970.
- 2. Except where otherwise stated, the term "ratings" in this Schedule should be read as including Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officer, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, ratings and other ranks of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and the Women's Royal Naval Service, and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.

SECTION I

Service Pensions and Terminal Grants

Conditions of Award

- 3. A service pension and terminal grant assessed as in Clauses 6 to 14 may be awarded to:
- (a) A rating discharged otherwise than for misconduct or for inefficiency within his own control, provided he has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service.
- (b) A rating who is invalided after having undertaken an engagement or re-engagement which would normally enable him to qualify for pension under (a) above provided he has completed at least 12 years' reckonable service.
- 4. A rating whose services are terminated for misconduct or for inefficiency within his own control and who has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service may be granted such portions of the service pension and terminal grant assessed under Clauses 6 to 14 as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, having regard to the circumstances of the case, but when the services are terminated for misconduct, the amount shall not in any event exceed 90 per cent of the award which would have been admissible had the discharge been on other grounds.
- 5. A rating who is discharged not more than 3 months before completing 22 years' reckonable service so that he may enter civil employment which he has obtained but which cannot be held open for him, may be awarded a service pension and terminal grant calculated on the actual reckonable service he has rendered, provided that this is not less than 21 years and 9 months.

Assessment of Pension

- 6. Except as provided in Clauses 7 to 9, pension will be based on the length of reckonable service and on the highest paid rank, whether acting or confirmed, held for an aggregated period of 2 years or more during the 5 years' reckonable service preceding discharge to pension.
- 7. In the case of those invalided, pension may be based on the length of reckonable service and on the substantive rank held at the time of discharge provided the higher rate was a regular roster advancement if this is more favourable than the rule in Clause 6.
- 8. Where a rating has completed a pensionable engagement but is permitted to remain in the Service in a lower rank, he may on final discharge be awarded the pension for which he would have been eligible had he been discharged on the date on which he reverted to the lower rank (but calculated at the rates current on the date on which he is actually discharged), but with an addition based on his further service and rank as defined in Clauses 6 and 7.
- 9. Where a rating has been disrated for misconduct or reverted for inefficiency or unsuitability during 5 years preceding termination of full pay service and is eligible for a service pension under Clause 3, the rank on which such pension is to be based will be determined by the Secretary of State for Defence having regard to the circumstances of the case.

11. Addition for Aircrew Service. Where a naval rating has rendered aircrew service and has been awarded a service pension under the provisions of Clauses 6 to 10 an addition may be made, subject to Clause 13, at the following rates:

Pilots and Navigators 1s. 8d. (£0.0833) a week for each year of aircrew service.

Other Aircrew Categories 1s. 4d. (£0.0667) a week for each year of aircrew service.

- 12. Addition for Commissioned Service. When a rating had previous commissioned service and has been awarded a service pension under the provisions of Clauses 6 to 10 an addition may be made, subject to Clause 13, to that pension at the rate of 4s. 7d. (£0·2292) a week in the case of men and 4s. Od. (0·2000) a week in the case of women for each year of reckonable commissioned service, subject to a maximum of 9 years such service.
- 13. Maximum Rates of Pension. The rates of pension provided for in Clauses 6 to 10 shall not exceed 50 per cent. of the maximum rate of basic pay (including length of service pay) in force at the time of discharge, appropriate to the rank used for assessing the rate of pension, except that in the case of reckonable service in excess of 37 years, the maximum rate permissible will be increased by the over 22 rate of pension appropriate to the rank on which pension is assessed for each year of such service up to a maximum of 5 years.
- 14. Terminal Grant. A terminal grant in addition to service pension will be payable at a rate equal to 3 times the annual value of any pension awarded, a year for this purpose being regarded as 52 weeks. Where an addition in respect of a gallantry award is made to a pension under the provisions of Order in Council of 14th October 1947, such addition shall be omitted for the purpose of assessing the terminal grant.
- 15. Previous Service as Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airman. Previous service as a Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airman which is reckonable for pension purposes may be added to reckonable naval service for the award of a service pension and terminal grant. The pension and terminal grant will be assessed at the current rate appropriate for each period of service, but assessed for both periods at the rank determined under Clauses 6 to 9.
- 16. The rates in this Section are for complete years of service. Rares for residual parts of a year will be calculated proportionately according to the number of days.

Reckonable Service

- 17. Reckonable service for the purpose of determining entitlement to service pension will, subject to Clauses 18 to 20, be as follows:
 - (a) Inforfeited full pay service given, otherwise than as a commissioned officer, after attaining the age of 18 years, in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, Royal Air Force, or in the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, or in the former Armed Forces of India or Burma.
 - (b) Service as a commissioned officer which would reckon under Clause 28 of Section VI, Schedule I.
 - (c) Periods on full pay for the purposes of training while a member of the Auxiliary or Reserve Forces, except broken periods individually of less than six months' duration.
 - (d) Whilst a regular rating, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Funds which the Secretary of State for Defence may decide can reasonably be regarded as part of the rating's career as such. These will generally be appointments to which the rating brings his Naval knowledge and from which he acquires additional experience and which have been offered to him as part of his Naval service.
 - (e) In the case of women, full-time employment as a Naval Nurse in Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service or with the Navy, Army or Air Force as a member of a Voluntary Aid Detachment.
 - 18. The following shall not be reckonable service:
 - (a) Periods of imprisonment or detention, whether awarded summarily or by sentence of court martial; or confinement in cells.
 - (b) Time forfeited through conviction by the Civil Power; or consequent upon an Order under the Probation of Offenders Act.
 - (c) Time spent in desertion and, unless restored by the Secretary of State for Defence, any service preceding desertion.
 - (d) Any service during which pension is drawn except as provided in Sections IV and V.
 - (e) Service rendered by any person who shall have re-entered after having been dismissed from Her Majesty's Service with disgrace or discharged with ignominy.
- 19. (a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the rating received a service gratuity (including a gratuity in respect of supplemental or extended service), it shall be a condition of allowing such service as reckonable service under Clause 17 that the gratuity shall be refunded either in a lump sum or otherwise.
- (b) In any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Army or Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for the allowing of such service towards pension or gratuity that the person makes a payment to Naval Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise.
- 20. Service preceding a five-year interval in service will not be reckonable unless specially so allowed by the Secretary of State for Defence, and eligibility to reckon such service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. However, the following periods will not be regarded as intervals in service for the purpose:
 - (a) A period during which a man was a member of a Reserve Force undertaking, or liable for, periodical training.

(b) A period during which a man, although not a member of an organised reserve, remained liable for recall, provided his period of service included a period of war service. War Service for this purpose is defined as full pay service between 3rd September 1939 and 15th August 1946.

SECTION II

Service Gratuities

- 21. The provisions of this Section relate to ratings who are transferred to the Reserve or discharged from regular engagements without entitlement to service pension.
- 22. Reckonable service for the purposes of this Section will be as for service pensions in Clauses 17 to 20 of Section I. Where the total of reckonable service is not in complete years the residual period of less than a year will be reckonable in calculating the amount of the gratuity. The award for the residual part of a year will be calculated, according to the number of days, as a proportion of the increase for the next complete year at the appropriate point on the scale.
- 23. Subject to the following provisions, a rating who has 12 or more years' reckonable service may be granted a service gratuity on the following scale:

- 24. Any rating who is serving on an engagement which carries eligibility to a service gratuity after 10 years' reckonable service will be eligible for the appropriate gratuity under Clause 87 of Order in Council of 28th July 1949, if discharged from the service with more than 10 but less than 12 years' reckonable service.
- 25. A rating who is invalided from a regular engagement with 3 or more years' service and does not qualify for a service pension, may be granted a service gratuity on the following scale:

For service of 12 years or more the normal scale given in Clause 23 will apply.

Service given before the age of 18 may be included as if it were reckonable service subject, where such service is allowed to count, to a maximum gratuity entitlement of £250 in the case of men and £220 in the case of women.

26. Special Provision for Aircrew Categories. Gratuities as follows may be paid to ratings of the Royal Navy who have rendered aircrew service and are discharged without entitlement to service pension.

... £86 for each year of reckonable aircrew service.
... £74 for each year of reckonable aircrew service. Pilots and Navigators ... Pilots and Navigators Other Aircrew Categories

These special gratuities are in lieu of the ordinary rates of gratuity under Clauses 23 and 25 but are subject to the same conditions of award.

Ratings who have rendered both aircrew and other service may be awarded either a gratuity calculated at these special rates based on the limited period during which they have rendered aircrew service or a gratuity at

the ordinary rates on the whole of their reckonable service, whichever is the more favourable.

Should a rating be invalided while on aircrew service, the minimum requirement of 3 years' service under Clause 25 will not apply and a special gratuity under this Clause appropriate to the length of reckonable aircrew service may be awarded.

- Previous Service as Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airmen. Previous service as a Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airman which is reckonable for gratuity purposes may be added to reckonable naval service for the award of a gratuity on discharge. The amount of gratuity payable is the sum of the amounts for each period of service, each amount being related to the gratuity payable on the total reckonable time on the current scale for each Service in the proportion of reckonable time in that Service to total reckonable time.
- 28. Where a rating is discharged for misconduct or for inefficiency within his own control, the award of a service gratuity and its amount will be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence; but where the discharge is for misconduct any gratuity awarded shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had the discharge been on other grounds.
- 29. The Secretary of State for Defence may stipulate that the award of any gratuity under this Section shall be conditional on the rating undertaking further service in the Reserves or other Auxiliary Force, and if the person refuses to undertake such service the gratuity, or such part of it as may be determined, shall not be payable.
- 30. A service gratuity will not be payable on re-engagement for further service, on appointment to a commission, or on discharge for the purpose of giving further full pay service in the Armed Forces.
 - 31. If a rating dies while serving no gratuity will be payable under this Section.

Section III

Service Pensioners Re-employed in Peace Time

- 32. Ratings who were in re-employment on a pensionable basis on or after 1st April 1970, will qualify on discharge for re-assessed service pensions and terminal grants in accordance with the following conditions, provided that the interval in service, as defined in Clause 20 does not exceed 5 years.
- 33. Where the period of continuous pensionable re-employment is 3 years or more, or the rating is invalided from re-employment, the pension and terminal grant will be re-assessed on total pensionable service (including re-employed service) in accordance with Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule. The amount of terminal grant will be reduced by the amount of any terminal grant previously paid.

- 34. Where a pensioner who was re-employed in a lower rank than that held when he was originally discharged to pension has qualified for re-assessment of his pension under Clause 33, he may on final discharge, if more to his advantage, be awarded the pension to which he would have been entitled at the time when he was originally discharged to pension, but calculated in accordance with Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule, together with an addition based on his further service and rank as defined in Clauses 6 and 7 of this Schedule.
- 35. Where the period of continuous pensionable re-employment is less than 3 years and the rating is not invalided, the pension will be re-assessed on total pensionable service at the rates laid down in the Order in Council under which the previous pension was awarded. A terminal grant, if payable under this Order in Council, will be re-assessed on total pensionable service and reduced by the amount of the terminal grant previously paid.
- 36. Ratings who re-enter the Service within 5 years of being discharged on redundancy will be required to refund a portion of the Special Capital Payment awarded to them as follows:—

In addition to the above a discount of a period equal to that by which service on redundancy was enhanced should be made from any subsequent service reckonable for terminal benefits.

- 37. Pensioners re-employed after an interval of over 5 years. Where a pensioner is re-employed on a pensionable basis after an interval in service of more than 5 years, as defined in Clause 20, the pension previously awarded will not be re-assessed on final discharge and no terminal grant will be payable. Where the period of continuous pensionable re-employment is 3 years or more, or the rating is invalided from re-employment, the pension previously awarded will be increased by additions in respect of the re-employed service at the rates shown in Clause 10. Where the period of re-employment is less than 3 years and the rating is not invalided, the additional service rendered will reckon for increase of the pension only at the rates laid down in the Order in Council under which the pension was awarded.
- 38. Pensionable re-employment—Definition. For the purpose of this Section re-employment on a pensionable basis shall be any period of re-employed naval service during which a long service pensioner has given up payment of his pension in order that such additional service may be reckonable for increase of pension on final discharge.
- 39. Officers Re-employed as Ratings. An officer who after being awarded retired pay is subsequently re-employed as an R.N. rating or Royal Marine other rank, may be dealt with under this Section as though his retired pay were a service pension.
- 40. Commutation. When a pensioner who has commuted a part of his pension re-enters the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines and ceases to draw pension he shall be required to refund the value of the commuted part for the period of further service. He shall be given the option of refunding the money by:
 - (a) deduction from his final pension, on discharge, for a period equal to the re-employed service of an amount equivalent to that commuted; or
 - (b) deduction from any terminal grant payable on final discharge; or
 - (c) further commutation of pension to provide a sum equal to the capital value of the commuted portion of the original pension for the period of re-employed service; or
 - (d) deduction from Naval pay while serving.

A deduction equivalent to the amount of the original part of pension commuted will be made from any revised award made on final discharge, but the commutation will be ignored in assessing the final terminal grant which will be based on the gross pension irrespective of commutation.

SECTION IV

Future Emergency Re-employment of Service Pensioners

- 41. This Section relates to:
- (a) Service pensioners recalled for service during a period of general recall.
- (b) Other service pensioners who give further service (otherwise than on normal or non-continuous service engagements) during a period of general recall to service on account of an emergency, or who are specially re-employed on full pay in anticipation of an imminent general recall.
- 42. The provisions of this Section may be brought into operation for such pensioners on such occasions and for such periods as the Secretary of State for Defence may, in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service determine.
- 43. A service pensioner will, during periods of further service to which these provisions apply, continue to receive his service pension subject to the conditions normally attached thereto.
- 44. On discharge or release from such service as a service pensioner, provided his service has been satisfactory and of at least 6 months' duration, may receive an addition to his pension of half the difference between:
 - (a) the pension for which his previous service qualified him, or would have qualified him under Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule, and
 - (b) the pension for which he would be eligible under Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule if his further service were added to his previous service.
 - 45. No terminal grant or additional terminal grant will be payable in respect of the re-employment.
- 46. An addition under Clause 44 of this Schedule, may be granted although the existing pension was assessed under regulations in force before 1st April 1970.
- 47. If service pensioners are employed with the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, the provisions of this Section may be applied to them at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence as if their further service had been with the Royal Navy, Royal Marines or Women's Royal Naval Service.

SECTION V

Ratings serving on regular engagements continuing in service during a Further Emergency

- 48. The following Clause will be brought into operation on such occasions, being periods of general recall to service on account of emergency as the Secretary of State for Defence may, in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service, determine and in respect of each such occasion may fix a date from which it will come into operation and after which it will cease to apply.
- 49. A rating serving on a normal regular engagement while this Clause is in operation, who completes 22 years' service reckonable for pension under Section I of this Schedule, may be allowed, with effect from the date of completion of 22 years' service, to receive an immediate award of service pension and terminal grant, calculated on 22 years' service. If he elects to receive pension while serving, he will thereafter be regarded for pension purposes as a re-employed pensioner under Section IV of this Schedule.

SCHEDULE VII

Abatement from Service Retired Pay and Service Pension in relation to Retirement Pension under the National Insurance Act

- 1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Women's Royal Naval Service and Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service; ratings of the Royal Navy and the Women's Royal Naval Service, other ranks of the Royal Marines and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service who
 - (a) enter the service on or after 1st July 1949; or
 - (b) re-enter the service, after a break in service, on or after 1st July 1949; except those who re-enter within 12 months of being invalided or those who have already been granted service retired pay or service pension before re-entry.

Any rating or other rank, the regular part of whose engagement terminated before 1st July 1949, but who continued to serve on the reserve portion of that regular engagement shall, if he rejoined the service on a regular engagement before the termination of the reserve portion of his previous regular engagement, be regarded as having continuous regular service for the purpose of this Clause.

- 2. The Secretary of State for Defence may exempt from the provisions of this Section any officer, rating or other rank, who entered or re-entered the Royal Navy after 30th July 1949, if satisfied that such entry or re-entry was in fulfilment of an undertaking or commitment entered into before 1st July 1949.
- 3. Except as provided in Clause 4 of this Schedule, service retired pay or service pension granted to a retired officer or pensioned rating or other rank shall be reduced by 4d. (£0·17) a week for each complete year of reckonable service, subject to a maximum of 16s. 0d. (£0·80) a week, on becoming eligible for a National Retirement Pension on attaining the age of 65, in the case of men, or on attaining the age of 60 in the case of women.
- 4. No abatement, however, shall be made in the case of a person permanently resident outside the United Kingdom, unless that person is receiving retirement pension under the National Insurance Act 1946, or a corresponding award payable under reciprocal arrangements with the country of domicile.

Whereas it is expedient to provide for revised rates and conditions of award of retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and gratuities for Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, for Officers and Ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service and for Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pensions) (No. 2) Order 1972.
- The provisions contained in this Order shall have effect from 1st August 1971.
- 3. The revised rates and conditions of award of retired pay, pensions, terminal grants and gratuities in respect of service in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Women's Royal Naval Service and Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service shall be as specified in the Schedules annexed hereto.

SCHEDULE I SECTION I

Service Retired Pay for Permanent or Pensionable Royal Navy and Royal Marine Officers

- 1. The provisions of this Section relates to officers holding permanent or pensionable commissions in the Royai Navy or Royal Marines, who retire from the Active List on or after 31st July 1971. Subject to the provisions of the Forfeiture Act 1870 and the Admiralty Pensions Act 1921, they relate also to retired officers whose commissions are terminated or whose names are removed from the List of Retired Officers because of misconduct. They do not apply to:
 - (a) Officers of Flag and General Rank of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines who retire from the Active List on or after 1st January 1971 and who, subject to the normal provisions, may be awarded retired pay at the rates specified in the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pensions) (Officers of Flag and General Rank) Order 1971—36*/N.P.P.
 - (b) Officers holding temporary or short service commissions or officers on the Supplementary List who have not been granted permanent or pensionable commissions.
- 2. Retirement for age or non-employment. An officer retiring on or after attaining the age limit fixed for service in his rank and branch, or, it having been decided that further employment is not available for him, retired compulsorily before attaining that age limit, may be granted retired pay, provided that, unless the special provisions set out in Clause 6 are relevant, he has completed at least 16 years' reckonable service as defined in Clauses 27 to 31 below. In the event of eligibility for full pay continuing after formal retirement, the award will take effect from the day following that in respect of which full pay was last payable.
- 3. The rate of retired pay will be based on the officer's rank for retired pay purposes, as defined in Clauses 22 to 26, and on the length of his reckonable service calculated in accordance with Clause 31.

- 4. Rates of Retired Pay. Subject to the provisions of this Section, retired pay may be awarded at the following rates:
 - (a) General List, Medical, Dental and Instructor Officers and Special Duties List Officers (Including Careers Service).

^{7.} Voluntary Retirement. An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service who retires at his own request on or after reaching the age of 40 years and before reaching the age of 50 years may be granted retired pay at the rates set out in Clauses 4 and 5 abated by 7½ per cent. At other ages the retired pay will be as indicated in Clauses 4 and 5.

^{6.} Late entrants. (a) If an officer was appointed to a permanent commission before 1st April 1960, at an age later than that of the normal entrant and, in consequence of his late entry, has not completed 16 years' reckonable service at the time of compulsory retirement for age or non-employment, as provided in this Section, retired pay may nevertheless be granted at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence provided he has completed at least 15 years' qualifying service.

An officer who has not served for at least 5 years after the grant of his permanent or pensionable commission will not be eligible for retired pay on voluntary retirement but may be awarded any service pension or gratuity for which he may be eligible by virtue of rating's service.

^{8.} Invaliding. (a) An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service will, on invaliding, be granted retired pay at the rate set out in Clauses 4 and 5.

⁽b) Officers invalided with less than 16 years' reckonable service, but with at least 10 years' qualifying service, will be eligible for an award of retired pay calculated as the proportion of the appropriate 16 year rate which their reckonable service, measured in complete periods of 3 months, bears to 16 years.

- 9. Retirement for Incapacity, Unsuitability, or Inefficiency. (a) Not within an officer's control. An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or for inefficiency, not due to causes within his own control, and having at least 16 years' reckonable service, may be granted retired pay as for a compulsory retirement on account of nonemployment.
- (b) Within an officer's control. An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency due to causes within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, and having at least 16 years' reckonable service, may be granted an award of retired pay at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, but not in any event exceeding the rate which would have been admissible had he retired voluntarily.
- 10. Retirement, etc. for misconduct. (a) An officer who is retired for misconduct with at least 16 years' reckonable service, may be granted retired pay at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.
- (b) Dismissal, etc. An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service who is dismissed the Service or dismissed with disgrace by sentence of Court Martial or whose name has been removed from the List of Officers or who has been allowed to resign his commission to avoid trial by Court Martial, may be granted a compassionate allowance at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent of the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request.
- 11. The Secretary of State for Defence may, in the exercise of his discretion under Sub-Clause 9(b) and Clause 10 grant a gratuity, or compassionate gratuity, in place of retired pay or compassionate allowance.
- 12. Special rules relating to officers promoted from the lower deck. An officer promoted to a permanent commission while serving on a normal regular engagement may on retirement be granted either:
 - (a) Retired pay under the conditions set out in this Section, or
- (b) Retired pay under the current rules for the award of ratings' pensions; whichever is more to his advantage.

Section II

Terminal Grants in Addition to Service Retired Pay

- 13. An officer retired from the Active List on or after 1st August 1971 and awarded retired pay under Section I of this Schedule, may be awarded a terminal grant, in addition to his retired pay, under the following conditions:
 - (a) The standard rate of grant will be three times the annual amount of the retired pay awarded under Section I of this Schedule.
 - (b) Except as provided in Clause 6 of Schedule III, an officer can qualify only once for a grant.
 - (c) The grant will be free of income tax.
- 14. A terminal grant under Clause 13 shall not be admissible in the case of an officer to whom Clause 10(b) applies, but a tax-free compassionate grant not exceeding three times the annual amount of the compassionate allowance may be awarded at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.
- 15. In the event of eligibility for full pay continuing after formal retirement, payment of terminal grant will not be made before the day following that in respect of which full pay was last payable.

SECTION III

Service Gratuities for Permanent Officers (other than Officers on the Special Duties List) and for Officers holding Pensionable Commissions on the Supplementary List

- 16. Permanent officers, other than those on the Special Duties List, and Pensionable Supplementary List Officers may on retirement on or after 1st August 1971 if ineligible for service retired pay, be granted a gratuity as follows:
 - (a) On compulsory retirement for age or non-employment or on retirement at own request, with at least 10 years' qualifying service:

 For the first 10 years' qualifying service £1,840

For each further year's qualifying service an addition of ...

An officer who has not served for at least 5 years after the grant of his permanent or pensionable commission will not be eligible for a gratuity on voluntary retirement but may, if he had previous rating service, be awarded any gratuity for which he may be eligible under the conditions relating to the award of gratuities to ratings.

- (b) On invaliding with less than the 10 years' service required to qualify for retired pay, a gratuity at the rate of £310 for each complete year of qualifying service.
- (c) If retirement on account of incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within his control:
 - (i) If with 10 or more years' qualifying service, a gratuity at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence not exceeding the amount which would have been admissible under sub-paragraph
 - (a) above.
 (ii) If with less than 10 but not less than 2 years' qualifying service, a gratuity at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence not exceeding £150 for the first 2 years' qualifying service with the sate of £150 for each additional complete year of qualifying service. additions at the rate of £150 for each additional complete year of qualifying service with for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency or achieved the complete year of qualifying service.
- (d) If retired for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency or other cause within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity of such amount as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, but not in any event exceeding the amount which would have been admissible under sub-paragraph (a) above had the officer retired at his own request.
- (e) If retired for misconduct, or on termination of commission for any of the reasons set out in Clause 10(b), with at least 10 years' qualifying service, a gratuity, or a compassionate gratuity, if the Secretary of State for Defence so decides and of such amount as he may determine, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent of the award which would have been admissible had the officer retired at his own request.

SECTION IV

Service Gratuities for Permanent Officers on the Special Duties List

17. If permitted to retire at their own request, on or after 1st August 1971 with insufficient service to qualify for retired pay, officers on the Special Duties List may be granted gratuities on the following scale, subject to the completion of a minimum period of 12 years' actual service from the age of 18:

- 18. An officer with sufficient service to qualify for an award of retired pay, or for an award of pension on ratings' scales (with special increments for service as an officer), will not be eligible for an alternative award of gratuity on the foregoing scale.
- 19. If retired on or after 1st August 1971 for misconduct, or on termination of commission for any of the reasons set out in Section II Clause 10(b) of this Schedule, with at least 12 years' actual service from age 18, a gratuity or a compassionate gratuity may be allowed at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, but not in any event exceeding 90 per cent of the award which would have been admissible under Clause 17 had the officer retired voluntarily.
- 20. Any officer who has served on a rating's engagement, conferring eligibility for a rating's gratuity on completing at least 10 years' service after age 18, will have a reserved right to an award under Clauses 17 and 19, on completion of 10 years' such service instead of 12 years.
- 21. If invalided with less than 10 years' qualifying service and with insufficient service to qualify for pension on the ratings' scale, a gratuity at the rate of £260 for each complete year of qualifying service may be granted.

SECTION V

Rank for Retired Pay Purposes

- 22. Subject to the following Clauses, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the substantive rank held by the officer on his retirement, provided that, unless the officer is invalided, the rank had been held on the Active List for the following minimum periods:
 - (i) Admiral; General, Royal Marines 1 year
 (ii) All other officers 2 years

23. Service as Acting Captain, Royal Navy, may be reckoned towards the requirement of 6 years' service as Captain irrespective of the date of substantive promotion.

Additions to retired pay for service in paid acting rank

- 24. Subject to the general conditions in Clause 25 below, paid acting and temporary rank held by officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Women's Royal Naval Service and members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service may reckon for increase of retired pay as follows:
 - (a) For each complete year (subject to a maximum of 3) for which the paid acting or temporary rank was held, there may be added one-third of the difference between the retired pay for which the officer is eligible and the retired pay for which he would have been eligible had his rank for retired pay been one rank above his substantive rank.
 - (b) Where an officer has failed to complete 2 years in a substantive rank required to qualify him for the retired pay of the rank such service may reckon for retired pay as if it had been acting or temporary rank.
 - 25 General Conditions
 - (i) Service from 3rd September 1939, will count.
 - (ii) In no case shall service in an acting or temporary rank earn a rate of retired pay higher than would have been earned if the acting or temporary rank had been substantive.
 - (iii) The "complete years" referred to in sub-Clause 24(a) need not be continuous in time but may be made up of broken periods.
 - 26. The Secretary of State for Defence may fix a date after which periods in acting or temporary rank will no longer be reckonable for additions to retired pay.

DEFINITIONS OF SERVICE

- 27. The following periods may be included in assessing qualifying and reckonable service for the purpose of the foregoing Clauses:
 - (a) Subject to Clause 30, full pay service (including mobilised or embodied service or for the purpose of training) as an officer, rating or other rank of the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army or the Royal Air Force or of the Auxiliary and Reserve Forces, and of the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, or of the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth or a Colony, provided that where appropriate such service would be reckonable as qualifying service under Army or Royal Air Force regulations; except broken periods each of less than 6 months' duration.
 - (b) While a permanent regular officer, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Votes which the Secretary of State for Defence considers can reasonably be regarded as part of an officer's career as such. They shall be appointments to which the officer brings his naval knowledge and from which he acquires additional experience and which have been officially offered to him as part of his naval service.
 - (c) Periods before 1st August 1938, on unemployed pay, or on half pay not following the sentence of a Court Martial or the expiration of full pay sick leave, will reckon as service in full up to a maximum of 6 months in any one period or 2 years in all. Any such service not reckoning in full under the above rule will reckon as a third, subject to a maximum of 6 years such service reckoning as two years.
- 28. Loss of seniority or time forfeited by sentence of Court Martial or Disciplinary Court will not involve loss of service for retired pay or gratuity.
- 29. Service preceding a five-year interval in service shall not be included unless specially allowed by the Secretary of State for Defence, and eligibility to reckon such previous service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. Where, during a break in service the officer has been a member of the Royal Naval Reserve, or other reserve of any of the Forces, undertaking or liable for periodical training, the period of such membership will not be considered an interval in service for the purpose of deciding whether the previous service is admissible.

PREVIOUS SERVICE FOR WHICH A NON-EFFECTIVE AWARD HAS BEEN RECEIVED

- 30. (a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the officer received a service gratuity, or in any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, or the Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for allowing such service to reckon for retired pay, that the officer shall make a payment to Naval Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise. In default of such payment as may have been stipulated, the previous service will not be allowed.
- (b) If an officer has continued to draw concurrently with full pay the retired pay or other analogous award payable in respect of previous service, the further service will normally not confer eligibility for improved benefits on final termination of employment.

COUNTING OF SERVICE

- 31. (a) Reckonable Service. All service as defined above from the age of 21 will count in full as reckonable service.
 - (b) Qualifying Service. All service as defined above from the age of 18 will count in full as qualifying service.

SCHEDULE II

SECTION I

Gratuities for Short Service Medical and Dental Officers

- 1. An officer entering the Medical or Dental Branches of the Royal Navy on a short service commission of 1. An officer entering the Medical or Dental Branches of the Royal Navy on a short service commission of 3 or 5 years' duration on or after 1st May 1961, may, if the full period of Active List service he has undertaken is satisfactorily completed, be awarded a gratuity at the rate of £500 for each of the first 3 years' service and at a rate of £750 a year thereafter. An officer entered on a 3 year commission who has applied before 1st September 1963, to extend his service by 2 years will be eligible for a gratuity of £3,000. Those applying for such extensions on or after 1st September 1963, irrespective of whether their original 3 year commission began before or after that date, will be eligible only for a gratuity of £2,500 on completion of 5 years' service. An officer entered on a 3 year commission who could, by a 2 year extension of service, qualify for a gratuity of either £3,000 or £2,500 may, if his further service beyond 3 years falls short of 2 years, be awarded an addition to his gratuity at the rate of £300 a year in respect of his further service. Officers permitted to extend their service beyond 5 years, and whose extension of service begins on or after 1st April 1968, will be eligible for an addition calculated at the rate of £400 a year for £300 a year.

 Otherwise the addition for further service beyond 5 years will be calculated at the rate of £300 a year. of £300 a year.
- 2. Women Medical and Dental Officers leaving on marriage or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retirement may be awarded a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service actually completed.

SECTION II

Gratuities for Supplementary List Aircrew and Electrical Officers other than those granted Permanent or Pensionable Commissions

3. Supplementary List Aircrew Officers may, on satisfactory completion of 12 years' service on the Active List on or after 31st July 1971 be granted a gratuity of £5,000 unless they have received the Aircrew Special Bounty as provided for in Order in Council of 29th October 1965, when they may be granted a gratuity of £4,000. Extension of service beyond 12 years will qualify for an addition at the rate of £500 a year.

Those who retire on or after 1st August 1971 on completion of 8 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £2,345. Helicopter Pilots retiring on or after 1st August 1971 on completion of 5 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,375.

- Supplementary List Electrical Officers entered on or after 6th February 1964 who hold a degree, or degree equivalent, in electrical engineering (or in science with suitable engineering subjects), or are Graduate Members of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or the Institution of Electronic and Radio Engineers, or who hold qualifications which approximate to, or which exempt them from Parts I and II of the Institution of Electrical Engineers' examination may, on satisfactory completion of 10 years' service on the Active List, be granted a gratuity of £3,500. Those who leave on completion of 5 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,375.
- 5. Electrical Officers entered before 6th February 1964 and retiring on or after 1st August 1971 will be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £275 a year except that officers holding the professional qualifications laid down in Clause 4 who on 6th February 1964 had completed less than 5 years' service will be eligible for a gratuity of £3,500 are represented by the service of 10 years' service. on completion of 10 years' service.

SECTION III

Gratuities for Supplementary List Aircrew serving on Pensionable Commissions

6. Supplementary List Aircrew serving on pensionable commissions to age 38, who leave at their optional breakpoints, will be eligible for gratuities calculated in accordance with Clause 3 above. If they leave at any time other than at their optional breakpoints any award of retired pay or gratuity will be assessed in accordance with the provisions of Schedule I.

SECTION IV

Gratuities in respect of other Short Service Commissions

- 7. An officer holding a Short Service Commission or a Commission on the Supplementary List in the Royal Navy under terms which provide for the payment of gratuity may, on satisfactory completion on or after 31st July 1971, of the service, including any extension of service he has undertaken, be granted a gratuity at the following annual rates:
 - £275 except that service below the rank of Acting Sub-Lieutenant will reckon only at the rate of (a) Air Traffic Control Officers £195 a year.
 - (b) Other Officers including Helicopter Pilots, but excluding Pilots and Observers of fixed wing aircraft

£275.

SECTION V

General conditions attaching to the award of Short Service Gratuities

- 8. Should the officer fail to complete the full period of Active List service which he has undertaken, an award may nevertheless be made as follows:
 - (a) If his service is terminated on account of disability not due to causes within his own control, he will be granted a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he has actually completed.
 - (b) If his service is terminated for non-employment, or for incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within his own control, or if he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service within 6 months of the completion of the full period of Active List service he has undertaken, he may be awarded either a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he has actually completed or a reduced gratuity at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine.
 - at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine.

 (c) If he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service more than 6 months before the conclusion of the period he has undertaken no gratuity will be payable to a Pilot or Observer unless he has completed at least 18 months' satisfactory service and is in possession of the flying badge, nor to an officer of any other Branch unless he has completed at least 1 year's satisfactory service. Thereafter he may be allowed, at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding three-quarters of the amount proportionate to the length of his actual service on the Active List.
 - (d) If his service is terminated owing to disability due to causes within his own control or to inefficiency or other cause within his own control but not amounting to misconduct, he may be allowed, at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding the amount which would have been admissible had he been allowed to terminate his service voluntarily.
 - (e) If his service is terminated on account of misconduct, the special payment of a compassionate gratuity shall be within the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence according to the circumstances of his case, but the award will not in any event exceed 90 per cent of the gratuity which would have been admissible had he left voluntarily.

- (f) In the case of aircrew officers proportionate gratuity will be calculated as follows:
 - (i) For service short of 8 years:
 - For the first 18 months' service at the rate of £205 a year. Fo. 18 months at the rate of £315 a year, subject to a maximum of £2,345. For service beyond the first
 - (ii) For service between 8 and 12 years, £2,345 in respect of the first 8 years and at the rate of £665 a year for the remaining period subject to a maximum of £5,000.
- (g) In the case of Professionally Qualified Electrical Officers proportionate gratuity will be calculated as follows:

At the rate of £275 a year for the first 5 years and at £425 a year in respect of service between 5 and 10 years.

- 9. No part of a short service gratuity will be payable to the Officer's estate or otherwise in the event of his death before completion of the period of Active List service he had undertaken.
- 10. If an officer serving on a short service commission continues on full pay beyond the period of Active List service which he had undertaken, payment of the gratuity will be deferred until the end of such further service.
- 11. A short service commission officer who was transferred to that commission from a pensionable commission solely because of failure to complete training due to causes outside his control including medical unfitness may, in addition to the gratuity in respect of his short service, be awarded on final satisfactory completion of service a gratuity at the rate provided for in Clause 16(c)(ii) of Section III of Schedule I in respect of his pensionable service.
- 12. A short service commission officer who is granted a permanent commission will not be eligible for any gratuity in respect of his service on a short service commission, but his service on that commission may count towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer. If, after receipt of a gratuity in respect of short service, an officer is granted a permanent commission his previous service will not be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer, unless satisfactory arrangements are made for the refund of the short service gratuity.
- 13. Service on a short service gratuity.

 13. Service on a short service commission in the medical, dental, or education branches of the Royal Navy, may, in certain circumstances, be treated as contributory service under the National Health Service (Superannuation) Regulations or under the Teachers' (Superannuation) Act, as appropriate. Where service is so treated, both the employer's and the officer's contribution will be advanced by the Ministry of Defence and the total amount so advanced will be deducted from the gratuity for which the officer is eligible under the provisions of this Section. When contributions have been so advanced but as a result of being transferred to a permanent or pensionable commission the officer does not qualify for a gratuity under this Section, no refund of the employer's contributions will be required from the officer, but in order that his previous service may be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer he will be required to refund the employee's contributions advanced on his behalf by the Ministry of Defence. Service which counts for service retired pay or gratuity may not also count as reckonable service for purposes of pension under the appropriate civil superannuation scheme. not also count as reckonable service for purposes of pension under the appropriate civil superannuation scheme.

SCHEDULE III SECTION I

Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines Re-employment in Peace-time

- 1. Except as provided in Section II an officer who is on retired pay may, while re-employed for training or on any authorised naval duty for periods not exceeding 6 consecutive months or aggregating 6 months or less in any 12 months, continue to draw his retired pay concurrently with any pay to which he is entitled; but payment of retired pay may be suspended when there is doubt about the duration of the period of re-employment. No retired pay will be payable when the period of re-employment exceeds 6 months, and where the retired officer has commuted any part of the retired pay which would have been liable to suspension had he not commuted, a deduction equivalent to the amount commuted will be made from his pay.
- 2. An officer whose service retired pay has been suspended under Clause 1 and who, having been placed on the Retired List before 1st August 1971 is re-employed on or after that date without an actual break in service, will be eligible on reversion to the Retired List for awards of retired pay and terminal grant under the provisions in Schedule 1, Sections I and II as appropriate for officers retiring on or after 1st August 1971 assessed on the basis of former service added to re-employed service.
- 3. An officer whose service retired pay has been suspended under Clause 1 and who, having had a break in service, is in re-employment on or after 1st August 1971 may receive on reversion to the Retired List an award of retired pay assessed on the basis of former service added to re-employed service as follows:
 - (a) Under the provisions of Schedule I, Section I, provided that
 - (i) the period of re-employment is not less than 3 years; or (ii) the officer is invalided from re-employment; or (iii) he originally retired on or after 1st August 1971.

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- (b) If the officer originally retired before 1st August 1971 and the period of his re-employment is less than 3 years and he is not invalided, under the provisions of the Order in Council under which his retired pay was originally assessed.
- 4. If during re-employed service an office has served in a rank higher than that held before original retirement and has received the pay and allowances appropriate to that rank, this service may be allowed to reckon for assessment of a revised rate of retired pay on a similar basis to that laid down in Schedule I, Section V, Clauses 24 and 25.
- 5. If the officer had originally retired at his own request, re-assessed retired pay under either (a) or (b) above will be on the basis of voluntary retirement, unless he is invalided from re-employment.
- 6. An officer whose retired pay has been suspended under Clause 1 may receive, on reversion to the Retired List on or after 1st August 1971 terminal grant or additional terminal grant calculated as follows:
 - (a) If retired pay has been re-assessed under Sub-Clauses 3(a)(i) or 3(a)(ii) above, the award shall be, for each complete year of re-employed service, one-tenth of the difference between 3 times the annual amount of retired pay awarded on termination of re-employment and the terminal grant (if any) previously awarded.
 - (b) If retired pay has been re-assessed under Sub-Clause 3(b) above, and the officer originally retired before 1st January 1956, as in Sub-Clause (a) above.
 - (c) If retired pay has been re-assessed under Sub-Clause 3(a)(iii), or under Sub-Clause 3(b) above where the officer originally retired on or after 1st January 1956, the difference between the terminal grant previously awarded and 3 times the amount of retired pay awarded on termination of re-employment.
- An officer who originally retired at his own request with a gratuity only, may receive an additional gratuity of £275 for each completed year of re-employed service.
- 8. An officer who re-enters the Service within 5 years of being discharged on redundancy will be required to refund a portion of the Special Capital Payment awarded to him as follows:

SECTION II

Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines: Re-employment in Emergency

- 9. On recall for service at a time of imminent national danger or of great emergency, or when re-employed with the armed forces on general mobilisation, one-half of the retired pay of a retired officer will remain in issue concurrently with the pay and allowances appropriate to his rank on re-employment. Any portion of the retired pay that has been commuted will be recovered from the retired pay remaining in issue, or, when this is insufficient to meet the liability, from his pay to the extent of the deficiency.
- 10. For the purpose of applying the provisions of Clause 9 to a retired officer compulsorily recalled at a time of national emergency when general mobilisation has not been announced, the operative period will be determined by the Secretary of State for Defence in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service.

SCHEDULE IV

Officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service (Note—For the general purposes of the regulations in this Schedule, the term "Officer" shall include a member of the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.)

1. Except as otherwise provided in this Schedule, officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service (WRNS) and members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service (QARNNS) holding appointments in the Permanent Service who retire from the Active List on or after 1st August 1971 may be granted retired pay or gratuities under the general conditions applicable to officers of the Royal Navy holding permanent regular commissions as prescribed in Schedule I, Section I. The rates will be 87 per cent of the rates for men officers of equivalent rank as indicated below.

- 2. The general conditions in Schedule I, Sections II, III, V (as amplified in Clause 7 below), Section V of Schedule II and Sections I and II of Schedule III will also apply to officers except as provided in Clauses 4 to 6 following.
- 3. Retirement on marriage, or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retirement or termination of service, on or after 1st August 1971 to be treated as compulsory retirement for purposes of awards of retired pay.
- 4. Gratuities for Third Officers, W.R.N.S. retired compulsorily after 7 years' service. Third Officers, W.R.N.S. who are retired compulsorily for non-employment on completion of 7 years' service in the rank will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,674.75.
- 5. Gratuities for Officers on short service engagements (a) W.R.N.S. Officers. W.R.N.S. Officers granted short service commissions and who satisfactorily complete a 7-year commission on or after 31st July 1971 will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,674·75. On optional withdrawal after satisfactorily completing 5 years' service on a short service commission, they will be eligible for a gratuity of £1,196·25.
- (b) Nursing Sisters. Nursing Sisters entered for short service will, on satisfactorily completing the period of service undertaken, be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £239.25 for each year of short service.
- 6. Gratuities for permanent and short service officers leaving on marriage or for compassionate reasons.

 (a) Permanent officers who have completed at least 4 years' service as officers and who, being ineligible for retired pay or for gratuities under the provisions of the foregoing Clauses, are permitted to retire or are required to terminate their service on marriage, or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons, necessitate retirement or termination of service, on or after 1st August 1971 may be awarded a gratuity of £160.08 for each complete year of qualifying service subject to a maximum of £1,600.80.
- (b) Short service officers whose service is terminated for the reasons stated in the preceding Sub-Clause will be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £239 25 a year proportionate to the length of short service commission actually completed. The minimum of 1 year's service stipulated in Sub-Clause 8(c) of Section V of Schedule II may be disregarded for purposes of awards under this Sub-Clause.
- 7. Definitions of service of permanent officers. Within the limits prescribed in Clause 31 of Schedule I, and except as provided in the modified regulations set out in Clause 6 above, all full-pay service as an officer of the W.R.N.S. or as a member of the Q.A.R.N.N.S. or Q.A.R.N.N.S. Reserve or service as a rating in the W.R.N.S. may be taken into account in assessing qualifying and reckonable service for the award of retired pay and gratuities, as may service that would be treated as qualifying or reckonable service under Army and Royal Air Force Regulations.

SCHEDULE V

- 1. The provisions of this Schedule to apply only to officers serving under the terms and conditions laid down in Order in Council (No. 96/CE) of 23rd July 1931, and subsequent amending Orders in Council, who retire from the Active List at their own request before reaching the age of 45 in order to accept appointments in or under the Naval Ordnance Inspection Division of the Weapons Department of the Ministry of Defence (Navy Department) as members of the Works Group (Variant) Class of the Home Civil Service.
- 2. Such officers to be eligible from the date of their retirement from the Active List for awards of retired pay and terminal grant at the rates and under the conditions in force at the time of their retirement for officers on the General Active List who are retired compulsorily for age or non-employment; but not for any increase that might otherwise be payable in respect of service in acting and temporary rank under Clauses 24 to 26 of Section V of Schedule I.
- 3. Any officer who, having retired from the Active List under the foregoing Clauses, voluntarily terminates his service in or under the Naval Ordnance Inspection Division within three years of taking up an appointment as a member of the Works Group (Variant) Class thereupon to have his retired pay reduced to the rate that would

have been payable, less any part commuted, at the time of his retirement from the Active List had that retirement been treated as though it were that of an officer on the General Active List retired at his own request; and to refund to the Ministry of Defence:

- (a) the difference between the higher and lower rates of retired pay in respect of the period during which the former was in payment; and
- (b) the difference between terminal grants based on the higher and lower rates of retired pay.

Payment of retired pay to be discontinued until arrangements satisfactory to the Ministry of Defence have been made for refund of the amounts due.

SCHEDULE VI

- 1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to ratings of the Royal Navy, other ranks of the Royal Marines, ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service who give service on full pay on or after 31st July 1971. They do not apply to R.N. Locally Entered ratings other than Maltese. The rates of pension are effective from 1st August 1971.
- 2. Except where otherwise stated, the term "ratings" in this Schedule should be read as including Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, ratings and other ranks of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and the Women's Royal Naval Service, and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.

SECTION I

Service Pensions and Terminal Grants

Conditions of Award

- 3. A service pension and terminal grant assessed as in Clauses 6 to 14 may be awarded to:
- (a) A rating discharged otherwise than for misconduct or for inefficiency within his own control, provided he has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service.
- (b) A rating who is invalided after having undertaken an engagement or re-engagement which would normally enable him to qualify for pension under (a) above provided he has completed at least 12 years' reckonable
- 4. A rating whose services are terminated for misconduct or for inefficiency within his own control and who has completed at least 22 years' reckonable service may be granted such portions of the service pension and terminal grant assessed under Clauses 6 to 14 as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, having regard to the circumstances of the case, but when the services are terminated for misconduct, the amount shall not in any event exceed 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had the discharge been on other grounds.
- 5. A rating who is discharged not more than 3 months before completing 22 years' reckonable service so that he may enter civil employment which he has obtained but which cannot be held open for him, may be awarded a service pension and terminal grant calculated on the actual reckonable service he has rendered, provided that this is not less than 21 years and 9 months.

Assessment of Pension

- 6. Except as provided in Clauses 7 to 9, pension will be based on the length of reckonable service and on the highest paid rank, whether acting or confirmed, held for an aggregated period of 2 years or more during the 5 years' reckonable service preceding discharge to pension.
- 7. In the case of those invalided, pension may be based on the length of reckonable service and on the substantive rank held at the time of discharge provided the higher rate was a regular roster advancement if this is more favourable than the rule in Clause 6.
- 8. Where a rating has completed a pensionable engagement but is permitted to remain in the Service in a lower rank, he may on final discharge be awarded the pension for which he would have been eligible had he been discharged on the date on which he reverted to the lower rank (but calculated at the rates current on the date on which he is actually discharged), but with an addition based on his further service and rank as defined in Clauses 6 and 7.
- 9. Where a rating has been disrated for misconduct or reverted for inefficiency or unsuitability during 5 years preceding termination of full pay service and is eligible for a service pension under Clause 3, the rank on which such pension is to be based will be determined by the Secretary of State for Defence having regard to the circumstances of the case.
 - 10. Subject to Clause 13, pensions will be assessed at the following rates:

11. Addition for Aircrew Service. Where a naval rating has rendered aircrew service and has been awarded a service pension under the provisions of Clauses 6 to 10 an addition may be made, subject to Clause 13, at the following rates:

Pilots and Navigators £0.09 a week for each year of aircrew service. Other Aircrew Categories £0.08 a week for each year of aircrew service.

- 12. Addition for Commissioned Service. Where a rating had previous commissioned service and has been awarded a service pension under the provisions of Clauses 6 to 10 an addition may be made, subject to Clause 13, to that pension at the rate of £0.25 a week in the case of men and £0.22 a week in the case of women for each year of reckonable commissioned service, subject to a maximum of 9 years such service.
- 13. Maximum Rates of Pension. The rates of pension provided for in Clauses 6 to 10 shall not exceed 50 per cent of the maximum rate of basic pay (including length of service pay) in force at the time of discharge, appropriate to the rank used for assessing the rate of pension, except that in the case of reckonable service in excess of 37 years, the maximum rate permissible will be increased by the over 22 rate of pension appropriate to the rank on which pension is assessed for each year of such service up to a maximum of 5 years.
- 14. Terminal Grant. A terminal grant in addition to service pension will be payable at a rate equal to 3 times the annual value of any pension awarded, a year for this purpose being regarded as 52 weeks. Where an addition in respect of a gallantry award is made to a pension under the provisions of Order in Council of 14th October 1947, such addition shall be omitted for the purpose of assessing the terminal grant.
- 15. Previous Service as Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airman. Previous service as a Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airman which is reckonable for pension purposes may be added to reckonable naval service for the award of a service pension and terminal grant. The pension and terminal grant will be assessed at the current rate appropriate for each period of service, but assessed for both periods at the rank determined under Clauses 6 to 9.
- 16. The rates in this Section are for complete years of service. Rates for residual parts of a year will be calculated proportionately according to the number of days.

 Reckonable Service
- 17. Reckonable service for the purpose of determining entitlement to service pension will, subject to Clauses 18 to 20, be as follows:
 - (a) Unforfeited full pay service given, otherwise than as a commissioned officer, after attaining the age of 18 years, in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, Royal Air Force, or in the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, or in the former Armed Forces of India or Burma.
 - (b) Service as a commissioned officer which would reckon under Clause 27 of Section V, Schedule I.
 - (c) Periods on full pay for the purposes of training while a member of the Auxiliary or Reserve Forces, except broken periods individually of less than six months' duration.
 - (d) Whilst a regular rating, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Funds which the Secretary of State for Defence may decide can reasonably be regarded as part of the rating's career as such. These will generally be appointments to which the rating brings his Naval knowledge and from which he acquires additional experience and which have been offered to him as part of his Naval service.
 - (e) In the case of women, full-time employment as a Naval Nurse in Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service or with the Navy, Army or Air Force as a member of a Voluntary Aid Detachment.
 - 18. The following shall not be reckonable service:
 - (a) Periods of imprisonment or detention, whether awarded summarily or by sentence of court martial; or confinement in cells.
 - (b) Time forfeited through conviction by the Civil Power; or consequent upon an Order under the Probation of Offenders Act.
 - (c) Time spent in desertion and, unless restored by the Secretary of State for Defence, any service preceding desertion.
 - (d) Any service during which pension is drawn except as provided in Sections IV and V.
 - (e) Service rendered by any person who shall have re-entered after having been dismissed from Her Majesty's Service with disgrace or discharged with ignominy.
- 19.—(a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the rating received a service gratuity (including a gratuity in respect of supplemental or extended service), it shall be a condition of allowing such service as reckonable service under Clause 17 that the gratuity shall be refunded either in a lump sum or otherwise.
- (b) In any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Army or Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for the allowing of such service towards pension or gratuity that the person makes a payment to Naval Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise.
- 20. Service preceding a five-year interval in service will not be reckonable unless specially so allowed by the Secretary of State for Defence, and eligibility to reckon such service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. However, the following periods will not be regarded as intervals in service for the purpose:
 - (a) A period during which a man was a member of a Reserve Force undertaking, or liable for, periodical training.
 - (b) A period during which a man, although not a member of an organised reserve, remained liable for recall, provided his period of service included a period of war service. War Service for this purpose is defined as full pay service between 3rd September 1939 and 15th August 1946.

SECTION II

Service Gratuities

- 21. The provisions of this Section relate to ratings who are transferred to the Reserve or discharged from regular engagements without entitlement to service pension.
- 22. Reckonable service for the purposes of this Section will be as for service pensions in Clause 17 to 20 of Section I. Where the total of reckonable service is not in complete years the residual period of less than a year will be reckonable in calculating the amount of the gratuity. The award for the residual part of a year will be calculated, according to the number of days, as a proportion of the increase for the next complete year at the appropriate point on the scale.
- 23. Subject to the following provisions, a rating who has 12 or more years' reckonable service may be granted a service gratuity on the following scale:

- 24. Any rating who is serving on an engagement which carries eligibility to a service gratuity after 10 years' reckonable service will be eligible for the appropriate gratuity under Clause 87 of Order in Council of 28th July 1949, if discharged from the service with more than 10 but less than 12 years' reckonable service.
- 25. A rating who is invalided from a regular engagement with 3 or more years' service and does not qualify for a service pension, may be granted a service gratuity on the following scale:

For service of 12 years or more the normal scale given in Clause 23 will apply.

Service given before the age of 18 may be included as if it were reckonable service subject, where such service is allowed to count, to a maximum gratuity entitlement of £270 in the case of men and £235 in the case of women.

26. Special Provision for Aircrew Categories. Gratuities as follows may be paid to ratings of the Royal Navy who have rendered aircrew service and are discharged without entitlement to service pension.

... £92 for each year of reckonable aircrew service... £79 for each year of reckonable aircrew service. Pilots and Navigators ... Other Aircrew Categories ...

These special gratuities are in lieu of the ordinary rates of gratuity under Clauses 23 and 25 but are subject to the same conditions of award.

Ratings who have rendered both aircrew and other service may be awarded either a gratuity calculated at these special rates based on the limited period during which they have rendered aircrew service or a gratuity at the ordinary rates on the whole of their reckonable service, whichever is the more favourable.

Should a rating be invalided while on aircrew service, the minimum requirement of 3 years' service under Clause 25 will not apply and a special gratuity under this Clause appropriate to the length of reckonable aircrew

service may be awarded.

- 27. Previous Service as Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airmen. Previous service as a Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airman which is reckonable for gratuity purposes may be added to reckonable naval service for the award of a gratuity on discharge. The amount of gratuity payable is the sum of the amounts for each period of service, each amount being related to the gratuity payable on the total reckonable time on the current scale for each Service in the proportion of reckonable time in that Service to total reckonable time.
- 28. Where a rating is discharged for misconduct or for inefficiency within his own control, the award of a service gratuity and its amount will be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence; but where the discharge is for misconduct any gratuity awarded shall not exceed 90 per cent of the award which would have been admissible had the discharge been on other grounds.
- 29. The Secretary of State for Defence may stipulate that the award of any gratuity under this Section shall be conditional on the rating undertaking further service in the Reserves or other Auxiliary Force, and if the person refuses to undertake such service the gratuity, or such part of it as may be determined, shall not be payable.
- 30. A service gratuity will not be payable on re-engagement for further service, on appointment to a commission, or on discharge for the purpose of giving further full pay service in the Armed Forces.
 - 31. If a rating dies while serving no gratuity will be payable under this Section.

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SECTION III

Service Pensioners Re-employed in Peace Time

- 32. Ratings who were in re-employment on a pensionable basis on or after 1st August 1971 will qualify on discharge for re-assessed service pensions and terminal grants in accordance with the following conditions, provided that the interval in service, as defined in Clause 20 does not exceed 5 years.
- 33. Where the period of continuous pensionable re-employment is 3 years or more, or the rating is inavlided from re-employment, the pension and terminal grant will be re-assessed on total pensionable service (including re-employed service) in accordance with Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule. The amount of terminal grant will be reduced by the amount of any terminal grant previously paid.
- 34. Where a pensioner who was re-employed in a lower rank than that held when he was originally discharged to pension has qualified for re-assessment of his pension under Clause 33, he may on final discharge, if more to his advantage, be awarded the pension to which he would have been entitled at the time when he was originally discharged to pension, but calculated in accordance with Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule, together with an addition based on his further service and rank as defined in Clauses 6 and 7 of this Schedule.
- 35. Where the period of continuous pensionable re-employment is less than 3 years and the rating is not invalided, the pension will be re-assessed on total pensionable service at the rates laid down in the Order in Council under which the previous pension was awarded. A terminal grant, if payable under this Order in Council, will be re-assessed on total pensionable service and reduced by the amount of the terminal grant previously paid.
- 36. Ratings who re-enter the Service within 5 years of being discharged on redundancy will be required to refund a portion of the Special Capital Payment awarded to them as follows:-Refund of Special

In addition to the above a discount of a period equal to that by which service on redundancy was enhanced should be made from any subsequent service reckonable for terminal benefits.

37. Pensioners re-employed after an interval of over 5 years. Where a pensioner is re-employed on a pensionable not be re-assessed on final discharge and no terminal grant will be payable. Where the period of continuous pensionable re-employment is 3 years or more, or the rating is invalided from re-employment, the pension previously awarded will be increased by additions in respect of the re-employed service at the rates shown in Clause 10. Where the period of re-employment is less than 3 years and the rating is not invalided, the additional service rendered will reckon for increase of the pension only at the rates laid down in the Order in Council under which the pension was awarded.

- 38. Pensionable re-employment—Definition. For the purpose of this Section re-employment on a pensionable basis shall be any period of re-employed naval service during which a long service pensioner has given up payment of his pension in order that such additional service may be reckonable for increase of pension on final discharge.
- 39. Officers Re-employed as Ratings. An officer who after being awarded retired pay is subsequently reemployed as an R.N. rating or Royal Marine other rank, may be dealt with under this Section as though his retired pay were a service pension.
- 40. Commutation. When a pensioner who has commuted a part of his pension re-enters the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines and ceases to draw pension he shall be required to refund the value of the commuted part for the period of further service. He shall be given the option of refunding the money by:
 - (a) deduction from his final pension, on discharge, for a period equal to the re-employed service of an amount equivalent to that commuted; or
 - (b) deduction from any terminal grant payable on final discharge; or
 - (c) further commutation of pension to provide a sum equal to the capital value of the commuted portion of the original pension for the period of re-employed service; or
 - (d) deduction from Naval pay while serving.
- A deduction equivalent to the amount of the original part of the pension commuted will be made from any revised award made on final discharge, but the commutation will be ignored in assessing the final terminal grant which will be based on the gross pension irrespective of commutation.

SECTION IV

Future Emergency Re-employment of Service Pensioners

- 41. This Section relates to:
- (a) Service pensioners recalled for service during a period of general recall.
- (b) Other service pensioners who give further service (otherwise than on normal or non-continuous service engagements) during a period of general recall to service on account of an emergency, or who are specially re-employed on full pay in anticipation of an imminent general recall.
- 42. The provisions of this Section may be brought into operation for such pensioners on such occasions and for such periods as the Secretary of State for Defence may, in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service, determine.
- 43. A service pensioner will, during periods of further service to which these provisions apply, continue to receive his service pension subject to the conditions normally attached thereto.
- 44. On discharge or release from such service as a service pensioner, provided his service has been satisfactory and of at least 6 months' duration, may receive an addition to his pension of half the difference between:
 - (a) the pension for which his previous service qualified him, or would have qualified him under Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule, and
 - (b) the pension for which he would be eligible under Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule if his further service were added to his previous service.
 - 45. No terminal grant or additional terminal grant will be payable in respect of the re-employment.
- 46. An addition under Clause 44 of this Schedule may be granted although the existing pension was assessed under regulations in force before 1st August 1971.
- 47. If service pensioners are employed with the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, the provisions of this Section may be applied to them at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence as if their further service had been with the Royal Navy, Royal Marines or Women's Royal Naval Service.

SECTION V

Ratings serving on regular engagements continuing in service during a Future Emergency

- 48. The following Clause will be brought into operation on such occasions, being periods of general recall to service on account of emergency as the Secretary of State for Defence may, in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service determine and in respect of each such occasion may fix a date from which it will come into operation and after which it will cease to apply.
- 49. A rating serving on a normal regular engagement while this Clause is in operation, who completes 22 years' service reckonable for pension under Section I of this Schedule, may be allowed, with effect from the date of completion of 22 years' service, to receive an immediate award of service pension and terminal grant, calculated on 22 years' service. If he elects to receive pension while serving, he will thereafter be regarded for pension purposes as a re-employed pensioner under Section IV of this Schedule.

SCHEDULE VII

Abatement from Service Retired Pay and Service Pension in relation to Retirement Pension under the National Insurance Act

- 1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Women's Royal Naval Service and Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service; ratings of the Royal Navy and the Women's Royal Naval Service, other ranks of the Royal Marines and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service who:
 - (a) enter the service on or after 1st July 1949; or
 - (b) re-enter the service, after a break in service, on or after 1st July 1949; except those who re-enter within 12 months of being invalided or those who have already been granted service retired pay or service pension before re-entry.
- Any rating or other rank, the regular part of whose engagement terminated before 1st July 1949, but who continued to serve on the reserve portion of that regular engagement shall, if he rejoined the service on a regular engagement before the termination of the reserve portion of his previous regular engagement, be regarded as having continuous regular service for the purpose of this Clause.
- 2. The Secretary of State for Defence may exempt from the provisions of this Section any officer, rating or other rank, who entered or re-entered the Royal Navy after 30th June 1949, if satisfied that such entry or re-entry was in fulfilment of an undertaking or commitment entered into before 1st July 1949.
- 3. Except as provided in Clause 4 of this Schedule, service retired pay or service pension granted to a retired officer or pensioned rating or other rank shall be reduced by £0·017 a week for each complete year of reckonable service, subject to a maximum of £0·80 a week, on becoming eligible for a National Retirement Pension on attaining the age of 65, in the case of men, or on attaining the age of 60 in the case of women.
- 4. No abatement, however, shall be made in the case of a person permanently resident outside the United Kingdom, unless that person is receiving retirement pension under the National Insurance Act 1946, or a corresponding award payable under reciprocal arrangements with the country of domicile.

Whereas it is expedient to provide for revised rates and conditions of award of pensions to the widows and children of deceased Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Family Pensions) Order 1972.
- 2. The revised rates and conditions of award of widows' and children's pensions in respect of the service of deceased Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines shall be as specified in the Schedule annexed hereto.

SCHEDULE

SECTION I

THE FORCES FAMILY PENSIONS SCHEME

The family pensions and other awards provided for in this Schedule are those payable in respect of the service of deceased Officers, Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and Men of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, and awards which are payable in respect of deaths which are due to service.

- 2. Except where otherwise stated, the term "Officers" in this Schedule should be read as including Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy and of the Royal Marines and "RN ratings and RM other ranks" should be read as including Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers and other ratings of the Royal Navy and Non-Commissioned Officers and other ranks of the Royal Marines.
- 3. Subject to the detailed regulations set out below family pensions may be paid to eligible members of the families of deceased Officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks who were entitled by service to half-pay, retired pay or service pension, or, where death occurred during service, would have been so entitled had they been invalided on the day they died.

SECTION II

FAMILY PENSIONS

4. The provisions of this Section are effective from 1st September 1971 and are applicable to the widows and children of Officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks provided the Officer, rating or other rank was granted, or was entitled to, half pay, service retired pay or pension, or if death occurred whilst serving would have been so entitled had he been invalided on the date of death; provided also in the case of RN ratings and RM other ranks (excepting Regimental Sergeant Majors, Royal Marines) that service reckonable for pension was given after 31st August 1950, and that, where death occurred before 4th November 1958, the following periods of reckonable service had been completed:

5. Widows' Pensions

The rate of widow's pension will be:

- (a) One third of the husband's half pay, retired pay, or pension as defined in Clause 5(b) or the rate according to the husband's rank provided for in Clause 6, whichever is the more favourable.
- (b) For the purpose of Clause 5(a) above, the rate of half pay, retired pay or pension will be the basic rate, ignoring, subject to the exception in Clause 19, Section IV, any commutation that may have been made, plus all the pensions increases appropriate to the basic rate whether or not the husband qualified for these increases by virtue of age or health. The age 70 addition payable under Order in Council (1*) of 17th January 1963 shall be included in the calculation.

Children

Each child one third or, if motherless, two thirds of the rate of widow's pension appropriate to the rank and service of the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank.

6. Minimum rates of Family Pensions. If the rates of pension calculated in accordance with Clause 5 would be less than those set out below, the latter would be payable to all widows other than those under 40 years of age without at least one dependant:

SECTION III

REVISION OF MODIFIED FAMILY PENSIONS

7. The following changes will be made in the provision for the grant of family pensions made in earlier Orders in Council when the death of the husband is due to service and the family is awarded an attributable pension:

(a) A widow receiving a modified family pension is, from 1st September 1971, eligible for a family pension at the rates as specified in Section II Clauses 5 and 6.

(b) The family pension will be abated by the following amount if a widow is receiving an attributable pension as the widow of an officer:

Children's pensions will not be subject to such reductions.

- 8. Minimum rates of Family Pensions where an attributable award is paid. If the rates of family pension calculated in accordance with Clause 5 would be less than those set out in Clause 6 the latter will be payable.
- 9. Age Addition. Widows in receipt of a pension at a rate other than a minimum rate whose husbands, if Officers, retired or died before 1st February 1962 and if RN ratings or RM other ranks, were discharged or died before 31st January 1962, may be awarded the age 70 addition provided for in Order in Council (1*) of 17th January 1963.

- 10. Definition of Rank for the Purposes of Minimum Awards of Family Pensions. Rank for the purposes of Clauses 6 and 7 will be as follows:
 - (a) Officers. The rank shall be the substantive rank held by the Officer on his retirement, provided that unless the Officer is invalided, the rank had been held on the Active List for the following minimum period:
 - (i) Admiral/General, Royal Marines 1 year (ii) All other Officers 2 years

Where an Officer dies while serving on the Active List the minimum period above will not apply. Higher paid acting or temporary rank will be taken into account to the same extent as for retired pay purposes.

(b) RN Ratings and RM Other Ranks. The highest paid rank held for an aggregated period of two or more years during the last five years of service preceding termination of full pay service (including service in a higher paid rank of less than two years' duration); or, if more favourable where the RN rating or RM other rank was invalided or died whilst serving, the substantive rank held at the time of discharge or death. If a RN rating or RM other rank who has completed a pensionable engagement is permitted to remain in or re-enter the Service in a lower rank, the rank will be the highest paid rank held for two or more years during the five years preceding the completion of such pensionable engagement if this is more favourable.

SECTION IV

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE AWARD OF FAMILY PENSIONS

11. Pensions cannot be claimed as a Right.

- (a) A pension cannot be claimed as a right and will not be granted or continued when the applicant is shown to be living with a man as his wife, nor will it be granted if the service of the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank has not been such as in the opinion of the Defence Council to justify the award.
- (b) If the death of an Officer or rating or marine, or the wound, injury or disease which resulted in his death, was due wholly or in part to his own negligence or misconduct or to any cause within his control, any grant which might otherwise be made to his widow or children may be withheld or reduced in amount at the discretion of the Defence Council.
- (c) If an Officer retired, dismissed the Service, or called upon to retire for misconduct or inefficiency, or a RN rating or RM other rank discharged for misconduct or inefficiency was not granted any retired pay or pension in respect of his service, no award will be made to the family. If reduced retired pay or service pension was awarded, the family pension will be at such rate as the Defence Council may determine.
- (d) If the applicant is granted any other pension or allowance from public funds on account of the service of the deceased, any pension which might otherwise be granted under this Schedule may be withheld or reduced as the Defence Council may determine.
 - 12. Conditions relating to Marriage.
- (a) To be eligible for a pension, a widow must have been married to the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank before his retirement or discharge; or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible for re-assessment of retired pay or pension, before the termination of such further service.
- (b) If the death of the Officer, RN rating, or RM other rank occurred within a year of his marriage, the Defence Council, in the light of the circumstances of the case may withhold or reduce the award otherwise admissible.
- 13. Effect of Separation on Widow's Pension and Gratuity. Subject to any exception which the Defence Council may approve in a particular case, an award will not be made to a widow who was separated from her husband at the time of his death. Should such an exception be approved, the award will be at such a rate, and subject to such conditions, as the Defence Council may determine.
- 14. Withholding or Diversion of Pension. In exceptional circumstances the Defence Council may withhold the whole or any part of a pension granted under this Schedule and may divert the whole or part for the benefit of persons dependent on the pensioner.
- 15. Date of Commencement of Pension. The date of commencement of pension will be determined according to the circumstances of the case and will normally, if application is not unduly delayed, be the date following the husband's death; or, if death occurred during service, the date following the termination of allowances issuable after death.
- 16. Belated Claims. If a widow dies before establishing her claim to pension, arrears of pension will not, save in exceptional circumstances, be allowed to her estate.
- 17. Re-marriage. The pension of a widow who re-marries will be suspended, but if she again becomes a widow her pension may be restored in whole or in part at the discretion of the Defence Council, if her pecuniary circumstances justify such restoration.
 - 18. Children.
 - (a) A "child" for the purposes of the award of a pension under this Schedule means:
 - (i) A legitimate child of the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank provided that the child's mother fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 12 of this Schedule, or;
 - (ii) a step-child if the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank who was mainly dependent on him at the time of his death, provided that the child's mother fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 12 of this Schedule; or
 - (iii) a child adopted by the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank, or by his wife, before his retirement or discharge (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible for a re-assessment of retired pay or service pension before the termination of such further service), who was mainly dependent upon him at the time of his death, and provided that the child's mother by adoption fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 12 of this Schedule; or
 - (iv) a child mainly dependent upon the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank before his retirement or discharge (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible for re-assessment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service), who was adopted by the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank, or by his wife after his retirement or discharge (or after the termination of such further service), provided that the Defence Council is satisfied that the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank had formed the intention of adopting the child before retirement or discharge (or before the termination of such further service) and that the child was mainly dependent upon him at the time of his death, and provided that the child's mother by adoption fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 12 of this Schedule; or
 - (v) an illegitimate child of the Officer, RN rating or RM other rank, or of his wife, born before his retirement or discharge (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible for re-assessment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service), who was mainly dependent upon him at the time of his death, and provided that, where the child is the illegitimate child of the wife, the wife fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 12 of this Schedule.
 - (b) A child's pension will normally cease when the child attains the age of 18 years in the case of the child of an Officer or a Fleet Chief Petty Officer or Regimental Sergeant Major, Royal Marines, or the age of 16 years in the case of all other ratings and ranks, but may be granted or continued after those ages:
 - (i) if the child continues to receive full-time education, or is an apprentice not receiving more than nominal wages; or

- (ii) if, before attaining the age referred to above the child was, and continues to be afflicted by mental or bodily infirmity and is therefore incapable of earning his or her own living, provided the Defence Council considers that the pecuniary circumstances of the child and family are such as to justify the award.
- (c) Children's pensions will be paid to the widow or mother of the child, or other person responsible for the child's maintenance, or to the child direct as may be decided by the Defence Council.
- (d) Pensions of children of Officers and of Fleet Chief Petty Officers and Regimental Sergeant Majors, Royal Marines, may be issued quarterly in advance.
- 19. Commutation of Retired Pay. The widow and children of an Officer who commuted a portion of his retired pay under the Pensions Commutation Acts of 1871 to 1882, or of a RN rating, or RM other rank who has commuted part of his pension shall not thereby be deprived of entitlement to pension under this Schedule, but the award to the widow of an Officer whose marriage took place after commutation, a legitimate or illegitimate child born after commutation, a step-child eligible by virtue of a marriage after commutation, or a child adopted after commutation, shall be reduced by a proportion corresponding to the proportion of retired pay commuted.

SECTION V

GRATUITIES TO WIDOWS AND CHILDREN ON THE DEATH OF SERVING OFFICERS, RN RATINGS AND RM OTHER RANKS

- 20. (a) The provisions of this section apply to the widows and children of Officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks who die while serving on full pay on or after 31st July 1971.
- (b) All awards under this section will be governed by the general conditions set out in Section III as applicable.
- 21. Where a permanent Officer or a short service Officer dies while serving on full pay on the Active List, his widow may be granted a gratuity as follows:
 - (i) If, had the Officer been invalided, he would have been eligible for a terminal grant, a gratuity equal to the terminal grant to which he would have been entitled had he been invalided on the day of his death.
 - (ii) In other cases a gratuity on the following scale for each year which would have been counted for service gratuity as an Officer.

- 22. Where a RN rating or RM other rank dies while serving on full pay on a regular engagement his widow may be granted a gratuity as follows:
 - (i) If, had he been invalided, he would have been eligible for a terminal grant, a gratuity equal to the terminal grant to which he would have been entitled on the day of his death.
 - (ii) If, had he been invalided on the day he died, he was not eligible for a terminal grant, his widow may be paid a gratuity in accordance with the following scale:

- 23. Where, had the Officer or seaman or marine been invalided, an adjustment would have been made to his award in respect of gratuity or other non-effective payment previously received by him, an abatement may be made on that account in assessing the gratuity payable under Clause 21 or 22.
- 24. Where the Officer or seaman or marine did not leave a widow eligible for an award under this section but a child or children (as defined in Clause 18, and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause), the Defence Council may at its discretion, award a gratuity to the child or children or to any of them. The total award shall not exceed that which would have been payable to a widow eligible for an award under this section and the award to any one child shall not exceed one-third of that amount.
- 25. Where the Officer or seaman or marine leaves a widow and in addition a child or children (as defined in Clause 18 and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause) who are not living with or supported by her, the Defence Council may divert a sum of not more than one-third of the gratuity which would normally be payable to the widow for the benefit of all or any of such children.
- 26. Where a woman member dies in circumstances, in which the child of a male member would have been granted a gratuity under Clause 24 above and leaves a child or children (as defined in Clause 18 and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause), the Defence Council may award a gratuity for the benefit of the child or children of such amount as it may determine.
- 27. Gratuities in respect of children may be issued to the widow or mother of the child, or other person responsible for the child's maintenance, or to the child direct, as may be decided. They may where appropriate be issued in instalments, or withheld for later payment.
- 28. Gratuities under this Section shall not be subject to abatement in respect of any Naval debt due from the deceased Officer or seaman or marine, other than any abatement due under Clause 23.
