The Trunk Roads (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No. 2) (Wales) Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 74 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, prohibiting the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 40 m.p.h. on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

SCHEDULE

That length of the Raglan—Abergavenny—Brecon—Llandovery Trunk Road (A40), known as The Watton, in the Borough of Brecon in the County of Brecon, which extends from a point 467 yards west of its junction with Camden Road to a point 466 yards east of that junction, a distance of 933 yards.

Town and Country Planning Act 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of those lengths of highway described in the Schedule below to enable development consisting of the erection of Magistrates Courts and ancillary offices to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted by Glamorgan County Council under Part III of that Act.

During 28 days from the 13th April 1972, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Offices of the Pontypridd Urban District Council, Municipal Build-

ings, Pontypridd and may be obtained, free of charge, from the Secretary of State (quoting Reference R15/349/5) at the address stated below.

SCHEDULE

Description of highways to be stopped up

(The distances are approximate)

The highways to be stopped up are in the Urban District of Pontypridd in the County of Glamorgan and are:

1. that length of road known as Zoar Street, which extends from its junction with that road known as Union Street in a northerly direction for a distance of 37 yards; and
2. that length of road, known as Station Terrace, which extends from its junction with that road known as Zoar Street in a northerly direction for a distance of 84 yards.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The London—Holyhead Trunk Road (London Road, Holyhead, Diversion) Order 1972

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 7 and section 44 of the above Act providing:

- (a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Holyhead in the County of Anglesey shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and
- (b) that the length of the London—Holyhead Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Secretary of State to the County Council of Anglesey (who
